4.	Title:	Criminal conviction; expungement of record upon showing opportunities for employment are prejudiced.					

- 5. Summary: Allows a person convicted of a criminal offense to have his conviction expunged after eight years has expired following the conviction, upon a showing that his opportunities for employment, education, or professional licensure are prejudiced by the existence of the criminal record. Expungement would not be available for someone convicted of a violent felony, a DUI-related offense, an offense for which registration on the sex offender registry is required, or domestic violence.
- **6. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Indeterminate (see Item 8)
- 7. Budget Amendment Necessary: No
- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed legislation provides for the expungement of certain criminal conviction records after eight years and requires the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) to maintain a list of all expunged records. Currently, DCJS does not handle expungements; therefore, the agency would have to make systems modifications and dedicate staff to implement the requirements of this bill which would result in a fiscal impact. The fiscal impact of this proposed legislation is indeterminate.

All expungements are handled by the Virginia State Police (VSP) and insomuch they would most likely be in a better position to carryout the requirements of this legislation.

- **11. Other Comments:** According to VSP, this bill would allow persons who have been convicted of criminal offenses to be employed in trusted positions and/or have access to any vulnerable populations.
