4. Title: Alcoholic beverage control; mixed beverage licenses.

5. Summary: Alcoholic beverage control; mixed beverage licenses. Permits the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to grant annual mixed beverage special events licenses to local governments for use in a building owned by a local government and listed on the National Historic Landmarks Survey. The bill also increases from 12 to 16 the number of events in any one year that a mixed beverage limited caterer licensee may sell and serve alcoholic beverages.

7. Budget Amendment Necessary: No

8. Fiscal Implications: The proposed legislation would allow the City of Alexandria's historic building known as Gadsby's Tavern to obtain an annual ABC license to host fundraisers. This legislation would also extent to other National Historic Landmarks (NHL) owned by local governments. There are a total of 118 NHL's and 13 Historic Sites (National Parks) widely distributed across Virginia's 95 counties and 39 independent cities. The Annual Mixed Beverage Special Event –Performing Arts Facility license would apply to such licensees with an annual tax of \$625 (\$560 license fee + \$65 non-refundable application fee). Assuming all 131 NHL's would qualify for such a license, the total revenues generated would total approximately \$81,875.

In addition, extending the number of events from 12-16 that the holder of the Mixed Beverage Limited Caterer's Licenses may hold per year does not present a fiscal impact to the agency.
