4. Title: Alcoholic beverage control; suspension and revocation; penalty waivers.

5. Summary: Alcoholic beverage control; suspension and revocation; penalty waivers.
Requires the ABC Board, by regulation, to establish a schedule of offenses for which any penalty may be waived upon a showing that the licensee has had no prior violations within three years immediately preceding the date of the violation.

6. Fiscal Impact Estimates:

7. Budget Amendment Necessary: A budget amendment would be necessary to account for the reduction in revenues that the proposed legislation would present to the agency.

8. Fiscal Implications: Over the past 7 fiscal years, the agency has collected between \$1.4-2.7 million annually in civil penalty revenues. In Fiscal Year 2008, civil penalties for first time offenders totaled \$1.3 million, which was 90 % of the total penalties (\$1.4 million) collected. Eliminating 90% of the penalties collected would require a corresponding downward revision in the profit estimate included in the Appropriations Act.
