**4. Title:**         **Restitution Payments Paid by Juveniles**

**5. Summary:** Provides that a court may, on motion of a probation or parole officer responsible for the case, convert an order for restitution, ordered to be paid by a delinquent juvenile, to a judgment for money when the juvenile reaches majority and all other conditions of probation or parole have been satisfied.

**6. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Indeterminate (see Item 8)

**7. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No

**8. Fiscal Implications:** According to the Supreme Court of Virginia, this bill would likely result in the creation of new procedures in juvenile and domestic relations district courts for the production of restitution judgments and some additional judgments being docketed in circuit courts. That said, it is believed these additional court transactions can be absorbed with current resources. It cannot be determined if additional fines and fees will be collected under this proposal.
