- **8. Fiscal Implications:** This legislation requires that the average teacher salary in Virginia shall not be less than the national average with such funds as are made available by the General Assembly for this purpose. Therefore, if no funds are provided to meet the intent of this legislation, there is no fiscal impact. The most recent national average teacher salary figure available from the National Education Association (NEA) is estimated at \$52,308 for the 2007-2008 school year. According to the same data source, Virginia's average teacher salary for that year is estimated at \$46,796. Based on the Governor's introduced budget, the Department of Education estimates the state share of costs to raise teacher salaries to the latest NEA national average in FY 2010 will be approximately \$415.0 million. Correspondingly, there will also be significant increase to the local share of costs.
