3. Committee: Senate General Laws and Technology

4. Title: **Government Data Collection and Dissemination Practices Act; collection of social security numbers.**

5. Summary: The Senate substitute bill extends from July 1, 2009, to July 1, 2010, the implementation of the prohibition against collecting an individual's social security number unless collection of such number is (i) authorized or required by state or federal law and (ii) essential for the performance of that agency's duties. The bill contains several technical amendments, all to become effective July 1, 2010.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Senate substitute bill's amendments are technical in nature and policy related with no fiscal impact expected to state agencies.
