This bill provides that one new member shall be a person who has public environmental health expertise and one new member shall be a representative of the emergency medical services community recommended by the State Emergency Medical Services Advisory Board.

8. Fiscal Implications: The legislation adds two members to the Board of Health, which currently consists of 13 members who are appointed by the Governor for four-year terms each. The estimated expenditure impact of the legislation includes travel, lodging, and meeting honorarium costs.

The fiscal impact assumes that the Board members do not live in the Richmond area and that the travel will be from their home to attend the four board meetings that are held in
