This policy shall be based on the Department of Education's Special Care Issues Guidelines relating to food allergies and anaphylaxis.

8.	Fiscal Implications: The Department of Education has already created guidelines to assist school divisions in creating such a policy. Therefore, this legislation should not have a state fiscal impact, but it can result in some administrative costs for school divisions that currently do not have such a policy. However, the Department of Education anticipates such costs can be absorbed within current resources.
