**4. Title:**         **Septic systems; nitrogen-reducing technology.**

**5. Summary:** Septic systems; nitrogen-reducing technology. Clarifies that the Department of Conservation and Recreation may award grants from the Water Quality Improvement Fund for the replacement or modification of residential onsite sewage systems to include nitrogen removal capabilities. The Board of Health may also require that conventional and alternative onsite sewage systems installed to accept sewage from new residential construction include nitrogen-reducing technology.

**6. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** The bill does not have a fiscal impact. See item 8.

**7. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The bill clarifies that the Department of Conservation and Recreation may award grants from the Water Quality Improvement Fund for residential onsite sewage systems. The Department of Health states that the bill will not have a fiscal impact.
