9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 18.2-383 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 18.2-383. Exceptions to application of article.
12	A. Nothing contained in this article shall be construed to apply to:
13	(1)1. The purchase, distribution, exhibition, or loan of any book, magazine, or other printed or
14	manuscript material by any library, school, or <i>public</i> institution of higher learning education, supported
15	by public appropriation;
16	(2)2. The purchase, distribution, exhibition, or loan of any work of art by any museum of fine arts,
17	school, or <i>public</i> institution of higher learning <i>education</i> , supported by public appropriation; <i>or</i>
18	(3)3. The exhibition or performance of any play, drama, tableau, or motion picture by any theatre,
19	museum of fine arts, school or <i>public</i> institution of higher learning education, supported by public
20 21	appropriation.
21 22	B. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection A, no public institution of higher education shall permit its facilities or any public moneys, including student activity fees, to be used for any of the
23	exceptions contained in subsection A unless the board of visitors or other governing body of the public
23 24	institution of higher education has approved each use in writing.
