10105132D **HOUSE BILL NO. 149** 1 2 3 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the House Committee on Privileges and Elections 4 5 6 on February 9, 2010) (Patrons Prior to Substitute-Delegates O'Bannon and Bell, R.P. [HB 1270]) A BILL to provide for the submission to the voters of a proposed amendment to the Constitution of 7 Virginia by adding in Article X a section numbered 6-A, relating to a property tax exemption for 8 certain veterans. 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 10 1. § 1. It shall be the duty of the officers conducting the election directed by law to be held on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2010, at the places appointed for holding the same, to open 11 a poll and take the sense of the qualified voters upon the ratification or rejection of the proposed 12 amendment to the Constitution of Virginia, contained herein and in the joint resolution proposing such 13 14 amendment, to wit: Amend the Constitution of Virginia by adding in Article X a section numbered 6-A as follows: 15 16 ARTICLE X 17 TAXATION AND FINANCE 18 Section 6-A. Property tax exemption for certain veterans. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 6, the General Assembly by general law, and within the 19 20 restrictions and conditions prescribed therein, shall exempt from taxation the real property, including 21 the joint real property of husband and wife, of any veteran who has been determined by the United 22 States Department of Veterans Affairs or its successor agency pursuant to federal law to have a one hundred percent service-connected, permanent, and total disability, and who occupies the real property 23 24 as his or her principal place of residence. The General Assembly shall also provide this exemption from 25 taxation for real property owned by the surviving spouse of a veteran who was eligible for the 26 exemption provided in this section, so long as the surviving spouse does not remarry and continues to 27 occupy the real property as his or her principal place of residence. 28 § 2. The ballot shall contain the following question: 29 "Ouestion: Shall the Constitution be amended to require the General Assembly to provide a real 30 property tax exemption for the principal residence of a veteran, or his or her surviving spouse, if the 31 veteran has a 100 percent service-connected, permanent, and total disability?" The ballots shall be prepared, distributed and voted, and the results of the election shall be ascertained and certified, in the manner prescribed by § 24.2-684 of the Code of Virginia. The State Board of Elections shall comply with § 30-19.9 of the Code and shall cause to be sent to the electoral 32 33 34 35 boards of each county and city sufficient copies of the full text of the amendment and question 36 contained herein for the officers of election to post in each polling place on election day. 37 The electoral board of each county and city shall make out, certify and forward an abstract of the 38 votes cast for and against such proposed amendment in the manner now prescribed by law in relation to 39 votes cast in general elections. 40 The State Board of Elections shall open and canvass such abstracts and examine and report the 41 whole number of votes cast at the election for and against such amendment in the manner now prescribed by law in relation to votes cast in general elections. The State Board of Elections shall record 42 43 a certified copy of such report in its office, and without delay make out and transmit to the Governor an 44 official copy of such report, certified by it. The Governor shall, without delay, make proclamation of the 45 result, stating therein the aggregate vote for and against the amendment. If a majority of those voting vote in favor of the amendment, it shall become effective on January 1, 46 47 2011. **48** The expenses incurred in conducting this election shall be defrayed as in the case of election of members of the General Assembly. 49
