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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 40.1-51.15 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 40.1-51.15. Fees.
13	A. For the certificate required under subsection B of § 40.1-51.10, a \$30 fee shall be charged. The
14	Safety and Health Codes Board shall establish <i>all other</i> fees required under this chapter. Following the
15	close of any biennium, when the account for the Safety and Health Codes Board shows expenses
16	allocated to it for the past biennium to be more than ten percent greater or less than moneys collected
17	on behalf of the Board, it shall revise the fees levied by it for licensure and renewal thereof so that the
18	fees are sufficient but not excessive to cover expenses. Such revisions, and the underlying rationale,
19	shall be included in the Department's Annual Report submitted pursuant to § 40.1-4.1.
20	B. The owner or user of a boiler or pressure vessel required by this chapter to be reviewed shall pay
21	directly to the Commissioner, upon completion of inspection, fees in accordance with the following
22	schedule:
23	1. Conducting or participating in reviews and surveys of boiler or pressure vessel manufacturers or
24	repair organizations for the purpose of national accreditation, shall be charged a fee as set under
25	subsection A per review or survey.
26	2. a. All other inspections, including variance reviews, emergency repair reviews, and reviews of
27	secondhand or used boilers or pressure vessels made by the Commissioner or his appointed
28	representative shall be charged a fee as set under subsection A.
29 20	b. "Secondhand" shall mean an object which has changed ownership and location after primary use.
30	C. The Commissioner shall transfer all fees so received to the State Treasurer for deposit into the
31	general fund of the state treasury.
