10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 18.2-340.19 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 18.2-340.19. Regulations of the Board.
13	A. The Board shall adopt regulations which:
14	1. Require, as a condition of receiving a permit, that the applicant use a predetermined percentage of
15	its gross receipts, excluding winner-take-all games, for (i) those lawful religious, charitable, community
16	or educational purposes for which the organization is specifically chartered or organized or (ii) those
17	expenses relating to the acquisition, construction, maintenance or repair of any interest in real property
18	involved in the operation of the organization and used for lawful religious, charitable, community or
19	educational purposes. The regulation may provide for a graduated scale of percentages of gross receipts
20	to be used in the foregoing manner based upon factors the Board finds appropriate to and consistent
21	with the purpose of charitable gaming.
22 23	2. Specify the conditions under which a complete list of the organization's members who participate in the menagement operation or conduct of abaritable gaming may be required in order for the Board to
23 24	in the management, operation or conduct of charitable gaming may be required in order for the Board to ascertain the percentage of Virginia residents in accordance with subdivision A 3 of § 18.2-340.24.
25	Membership lists furnished to the Board or Department in accordance with this subdivision shall not
23 26	be a matter of public record and shall be exempt from disclosure under the provisions of the Freedom of
20 27	Information Act (§ 2.2-3700 et seq.).
28	3. Prescribe fees for processing applications for charitable gaming permits. Such fees may reflect the
29	nature and extent of the charitable gaming activity proposed to be conducted.
30	4. Establish requirements for the audit of all reports required in accordance with § 18.2-340.30.
31	5. Define electronic and mechanical equipment used in the conduct of charitable gaming. For the
32	purposes of this subdivision, electronic or mechanical equipment for instant bingo, pull tabs, or seal
33	cards shall include such equipment that displays facsimiles of instant bingo, pull tabs, or seal cards and
34	are used solely for the purpose of dispensing or opening such cards, or both; but shall not include (i)
35	devices operated by dropping one or more coins or tokens into a slot and pulling a handle or pushing a
36	button or touchpoint on a touchscreen to activate one to three or more reels marked into horizontal
37	segments by varying symbols, where the predetermined prize amount depends on how and how many of
38	the symbols line up when the rotating reels come to rest or (ii) other similar devices that display
39	flashing lights or illuminations, or bells, whistles or other sounds, intended to entice players to play.
40	6. Prescribe the conditions under which a qualified organization may (i) provide food and
41 42	nonalcoholic beverages to its members who participate in the management, operation or conduct of bingo and (ii) permit members who participate in the management, operation or conduct of bingo to

4 4	7. Prescribe the conditions under which a qualified organization may sell raffle tickets for a raffle
45	drawing that will be held outside the Commonwealth pursuant to subsection B of § 18.2-340.26.
46	8. Prescribe the conditions under which persons who are bona fide members of a qualified
47	organization or a child, above the age of 13 years, of a bona fide member of such organization may
48	participate in the conduct or operation of bingo games.
49	9. Prescribe the conditions under which a person below the age of 18 years may play bingo,
50	provided such person is accompanied by his parent or legal guardian.
51	10. Require all qualified organizations that are subject to Board regulations to post in a conspicuous
52	place in every place where charitable gaming is conducted a sign which bears a toll-free telephone
53	number for "Gamblers Anonymous" or other organization which provides assistance to compulsive
54	gamblers.
55	B. In addition to the powers and duties granted pursuant to § 2.2-2456 and this article, the Board
56	may, by regulation, approve variations to the card formats for bingo games provided such variations
57	result in bingo games that are conducted in a manner consistent with the provisions of this article.
58	Board-approved variations may include, but are not limited to, bingo games commonly referred to as

59 player selection games and 90-number bingo.
