WHEREAS, Helen Perdue generously gave of her time and talents in the community, including serving on the altar guild at Trinity Episcopal Church and as a leader of her daughter's Girl Scout troops; and

WHEREAS, Helen Perdue was well-known in the community for her love of Halloween; she made annual trips to the elementary schools in October dressed as a ghost to tell scary stories to the children and residents of Rocky Mount came to her home to see her huge carved jack-o'-lanterns; and

WHEREAS, a vibrant and active woman, Helen Perdue enjoyed horseback riding with her husband, knitting, gardening, and golfing; and

WHEREAS, Helen Perdue will be fondly remembered for her kind and generous nature and will be greatly missed by her children, Emma Parcell, Nannie Leake, Randolph Martin, and Clyde Holland Perdue, Jr., and their families, and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it
