4	Directing the Joint Commission on Health Care to study feasibility of developing chronic health care
5	homes in the Commonwealth. Report.

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10	WHEREAS, chronic diseases can have a profound physical, psychological, and emotional impact on
11	an individual, his caregiver, his family, and society; and
12	WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported that approximately one half of
13	all Americans were affected by chronic health problems and that chronic health disorders accounted for
14	approximately 1.7 million deaths, or 70 percent of all deaths in the United States in 2005; and
15	WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Health's Division of Chronic Disease Prevention and
16	Treatment reported, in 2006, approximately four million cases of the seven most common chronic
17	diseases, including cancer, diabetes, heart disease, hypertension, stroke, pulmonary conditions, and
18	mental health disorders; and
19	WHEREAS, the enormous cost associated with chronic diseases lead to unnecessary and preventable
20	visits to hospital emergency departments, hospitalization, and lost work productivity; and
21	WHEREAS, health care homes have been shown to improve the quality of care, improve patient
22	outcomes, and reduce costs; now, therefore, be it
23	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Commission on Health
24	Care be directed to study the feasibility of developing chronic health care homes in the Commonwealth.
25	In conducting its study, the Joint Commission on Health Care shall review available information
26	including information about programs in other states to develop recommendations related to: (i)
27	standards for chronic health care homes which emphasize (a) the use of a range of primary care
28 29	practitioners and other professionals including care coordinators to provide high quality, patient-centered
30	care, including development of individualized comprehensive patient care plans, use of patient decision-making aids that provide patients with information about treatment options and associated
30 31	benefits, consistent contacts between patients and care teams, and systematic patient follow-up, (b) the
31 32	use of health information technology, (c) the use of evidence-based health care practices, and (d)
33	incorporate quality outcome, and cost-of-care measures; (ii) standards for certification of health care
34	facilities as chronic health care homes including ongoing reporting requirements for chronic health care
35	homes; (iii) development of a chronic health care home collaborative to provide opportunities for
36	chronic health care homes and state agencies to exchange information related to quality improvement
37	and best practices; (iv) enrollment of state medical assistance recipients with chronic health problems in
38	chronic health care home programs; and (v) costs associated with implementing a successful
39	demonstration program to test whether chronic health care homes can improve health care quality and
40 41	patient outcomes, and reduce costs associated with chronic health problems. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Joint Commission on Health Care
42	for this study, upon request.
43	The Joint Commission on Health Care shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30,
44	2010, and for the second year by November 30, 2011, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of
45	Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than
46	the first day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for each year. Each executive
47	summary shall state whether the Joint Commission on Health Care intends to submit to the General
48	Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or
49	Senate document. The executive summaries and reports shall be submitted as provided in the procedures
50	of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and
51	reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
