Celebrating the life of Myrna Miller Wellons.

WHEREAS, Myrna Miller Wellons earned the sobriquet "Mama Myrna" for her solicitous care of those on whose behalf she labored and to whom she provided both professional and personal care; and

WHEREAS, Myrna Miller Wellons embodied the virtues of "The Citizen" as extolled by Thomas Jefferson of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, Myrna Miller Wellons expressed a bountiful joy at the birth of her son, only to be afflicted by a catastrophic stroke from which she died on March 1, 2010; and

WHEREAS, Myrna Miller Wellons is survived by her devoted husband, Robert Shawn Wellons, and by the couple's infant son, Christopher Wellons, of Cary, North Carolina, and by a host of other relatives and friends, including many Virginians; now, therefore, be it
