3	(Proposed by the Senate Committee on General Laws and Technology
4	on February 10, 2010)
5	(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Blevins)
6	A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 27-95, 27-97, and 27-97.2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the
7	Statewide Fire Prevention Code; certification of fireworks operators and pyrotechnicians.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That §§ 27-95, 27-97, and 27-97.2 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as
10	follows:
11	§ 27-95. Definitions.
12	As used in this chapter, unless the context or subject matter requires otherwise, the following words
13	or terms shall have the meaning herein ascribed to them:
14	"Board" means the Board of Housing and Community Development.
15	"Code provisions" means the provisions of the Fire Prevention Code as adopted and promulgated by
16	the Board, and the amendments thereof as adopted and promulgated from time to time by such Board.
17	"Enforcement agency" means the agency or agencies of any local governing body or the State Fire
18	Marshal charged with the administration or enforcement of the Fire Prevention Code.
19	"Fire Prevention Code" or "Code" means the Statewide Fire Prevention Code.
20	"Fire prevention regulation" means any law, rule, resolution, regulation, ordinance or code, general or
21	special, or compilation thereof to safeguard life and property from the hazards of fire or explosion
22	arising from the improper maintenance of life safety and fire prevention and protection materials,
23	devices, systems and structures, and the unsafe storage, handling and use of substances, materials and
24	devices, including explosives and blasting agents, wherever located, heretofore or hereafter enacted or
25	adopted by the Commonwealth or any county or municipality, including departments, boards, bureaus,
26	commissions or other agencies.
27	"Fire Services Board" means the Virginia Fire Services Board as provided for in § 9.1-202.
28	"Fireworks" means any firecracker, torpedo, skyrocket, or other substance or object, of whatever
29 30	form or construction, that contains any explosive or inflammable compound or substance, and is
30 31	intended, or commonly known as fireworks, and which explodes, rises into the air or travels laterally, or fires projectiles into the air.
31 32	"Fireworks operator" or "pyrotechnician" means any person engaged in the design, setup, and firing
33	of any fireworks other than permissible fireworks either inside a building or structure or outdoors.
33 34	"Inspection warrant" means an order in writing, made in the name of the Commonwealth, signed by
35	any judge or magistrate whose territorial jurisdiction encompasses the building, structure or premises to
36	be inspected or entered, and directed to a state or local official, commanding him to enter and to
37	conduct any inspection, examination, testing or collection of samples for testing required or authorized
38	by the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code.
39	"Local government" means the governing body of any city, county or town in this Commonwealth.
40	"Permissible fireworks" means any sparklers, fountains, Pharaoh's serpents, caps for pistols, or
41	pinwheels commonly known as whirligigs or spinning jennies.
42	"State Fire Marshal" means the State Fire Marshal as provided for by § 36-139.2.
43	§ 27-97. Adoption of Fire Prevention Code.
44	The Board of Housing and Community Development is hereby empowered to adopt and promulgate
45	a Statewide Fire Prevention Code which shall be cooperatively developed with the Fire Services Board
46	pursuant to procedures agreed to by the two Boards. The Fire Prevention Code shall prescribe
47	regulations to be complied with for the protection of life and property from the hazards of fire or
48	explosion and for the handling, storage, sale and use of fireworks, explosives or blasting agents, and
49	shall provide for the administration and enforcement of such regulations. The Fire Prevention Code shall
50	require manufacturers of fireworks or explosives, as defined in the Code, to register and report
51	information concerning their manufacturing facilities and methods of operation within the
52	Commonwealth in accordance with regulations adopted by the Board. In addition to conducting criminal
53 54	background checks pursuant to § 27-97.2, the Board shall also establish regulations for obtaining permits
54	for the manufacturing, storage, handling, use, or sales of fireworks or explosives. In the enforcement of
55 56	such regulations, the enforcing agency may issue annual permits for such activities to any state regulated
56 57	public utility. Such permits shall not apply to the storage, handling, or use of explosives or blasting
57 58	agents pursuant to the provisions of Title 45.1. The Fire Prevention Code shall prohibit any person firm or corporation from transporting
58 59	The Fire Prevention Code shall prohibit any person, firm, or corporation from transporting,
37	manufacturing, storing, selling, offering for sale, exposing for sale, or buying, using, igniting, or

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60 exploding any fireworks except for those persons, firms, or corporations that manufacture, store, market 61 and distribute fireworks for the sole purpose of fireworks displays permitted by an enforcement agency 62 or by any locality.

63 The Fire Prevention Code shall supersede fire prevention regulations heretofore adopted by local 64 governments or other political subdivisions. Local governments are hereby empowered to adopt fire 65 prevention regulations that are more restrictive or more extensive in scope than the Fire Prevention Code 66 provided such regulations do not affect the manner of construction, or materials to be used in the 67 erection, alteration, repair, or use of a building or structure, including the voluntary installation of smoke alarms and regulation and inspections thereof in commercial buildings where such smoke alarms are not 68 69 required under the provisions of the Code. The Fire Prevention Code shall prohibit any person not 70 certified by the State Fire Marshal's Office as a fireworks operator or pyrotechnician to design, set up, or conduct or supervise the design, setup, or conducting of any fireworks display, either inside a 71 building or structure or outdoors and shall require that at least one person holding a valid certification 72 is present at the site where the fireworks display is being conducted. Certification shall not be required 73 74 for the design, storage, sale use, conduct, transportation, and set up of permissible fireworks or the 75 supervision thereof or in connection with any fireworks display conducted by a volunteer fire department provided one member of the volunteer fire department holds a valid certification. 76

In formulating the Fire Prevention Code, the Board shall have due regard for generally accepted 77 78 standards as recommended by nationally recognized organizations including, but not limited to, standards 79 of the International Code Council, the National Fire Protection Association, and recognized organizations 80 issuing standards for the protection of the public from the hazards of explosives and blasting agents. 81 Such standards shall be based on the companion document to the model building code referenced by the 82 Uniform Statewide Building Code.

83 The Fire Prevention Code shall require that buildings constructed prior to 1973 be maintained in 84 accordance with state fire and public building regulations in effect prior to March 31, 1986, and that any 85 building which is (i) more than 75 feet or more than six stories high and (ii) used, in whole or in part, as a dormitory to house students by any public or private institution of higher education shall be required to comply with the provisions of § 36-99.3. The Fire Prevention Code shall also require annual 86 87 88 fire drills in all buildings having floors used for human occupancy located more than 75 feet above the 89 lowest level of fire department vehicle access. The drills shall be conducted by building staff personnel 90 or the owner of the building in accordance with a plan approved by the appropriate fire official and shall not affect other current occupants. The Board may modify, amend or repeal any Code provisions 91 92 as the public interest requires. Any such Code changes shall be developed in cooperation with the Fire 93 Services Board pursuant to procedures agreed to by the two Boards. 94

§ 27-97.2. Issuance of permit; background investigations.

95 A. The State Fire Marshal or other issuing authority shall consider all permit applications for 96 manufacturing, storage, handling, use or sales of explosives and applications for certification as a blaster 97 or as a fireworks operator or pyrotechnician, and may grant a valid permit or certification to applicants 98 who meet the criteria established in the Statewide Fire Prevention Code. The State Fire Marshal shall 99 require a background investigation, to include a national criminal history record information check, of all 100 individual applicants and all designated persons representing an applicant that is not an individual, for a permit to manufacture, store, handle, use or sell explosives, and for any applicant for certification as a 101 102 blaster or as a fireworks operator or pyrotechnician. Each such applicant shall submit his fingerprints to 103 the State Fire Marshal on a form provided by the State Fire Marshal and provide personal descriptive 104 information to be forwarded along with the applicant's fingerprints through the Central Criminal Records Exchange to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the purpose of obtaining a national criminal history 105 106 record check regarding such applicant. Any firm or company manufacturing, storing, using, or selling explosives shall provide to the enforcement agency, the State Fire Marshal or other issuing authority the 107 108 name of a representative responsible for (i) ensuring compliance with state law and regulations relating 109 to blasting agents and explosives and (ii) applying for permits. The State Fire Marshal or other issuing 110 authority shall deny any application for a permit or for certification as a blaster or as a fireworks 111 operator or pyrotechnician if the applicant or designated person representing an applicant has been 112 convicted of any felony, whether such conviction occurred under the laws of the Commonwealth, or any 113 other state, the District of Columbia, the United States or any territory thereof, unless his civil rights 114 have been restored by the Governor or other appropriate authority. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the manufacturing, storage, handling, use or sales of permissible fireworks or in connection 115 116 with any fireworks display conducted by a volunteer fire department provided one member of the 117 volunteer fire department holds a valid certification.

118 B. No permit under this section shall be required of any person holding a certification or permit 119 issued pursuant to the provisions of Title 45.1.
