**4. Title:** Stormwater management regulations; effective date.

**5. Summary:** This bill extends the effective date of the regulation that establishes local program criteria and delegation procedures and the water quality and water quantity criteria to within 280 days after the establishment by the United States Environmental Protection Agency of a Chesapeake Bay-wide Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL), but no later than December 1, 2011. Currently, the effective date is July 1, 2010. The bill also directs the Virginia Soil and Water Conservation Board to convene an advisory panel of stakeholders to review the regulation and make recommendations on revision to the regulations that would be necessary to comply with such TMDL.

**6. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Final.

**7. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill delays the recently-approved stormwater management regulations that were to go into effect on July 1, 2010. As the regulations currently stand, they would require that certain localities adopt programs to administer new regulations for stormwater management; other localities are given the option of adopting programs, but are not required to do so. In the case that a locality opts-out of adopting a program, the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) is responsible for developing and managing a stormwater program for that locality. The Code of Virginia requires that all expenses related to the management of these programs are to be supported by nongeneral fund revenue collected from permit fees. As such, regardless of the effective date, the implementation of these new regulations is not expected to result in a general fund impact to the state.

**9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** Department of Conservation and Recreation; Virginia Soil and Water Conservation Board, soil and water conservation districts, localities.

**10. Technical Amendment Necessary:** No.

**11. Other Comments:** The version of SB395 engrossed by the second house is identical to this bill.
