**4. Title:** **Political contributions; prohibition during procurement process.**

**5. Summary:** Provides that no bidder or offeror, or person acting on his behalf, who has submitted a bid or proposal for the award of a public contract with an expected value of \$1 million or more pursuant to the Virginia Public Procurement Act shall make, directly or indirectly, a contribution to any campaign committee, political action committee, or political party committee during the period between the submission of the bid or proposal and the award of the contract. A person who violates this prohibition shall be subject to a civil penalty of up to two times the amount of the contribution.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The enactment of this bill would require State Board of Elections (SBE) to create a process to receive, track and report the data that comes in regarding the bids and proposals. SBE would further have to notify violators and inform them of their civil penalty. The staff time associated as well as potential technological changes would result in a cost increase to SBE.
