The proposed legislation would require that, in order to be admissible as evidence in court, confessions in the cases of rape, sodomy, forcible object sexual penetration, armed robbery, carjacking, and kidnapping must be recorded on videotape.

- 8. Fiscal Implications:

The legislation would require that sheriffs and local police departments have video recording equipment on hand in order to record such confessions. For those departments who do not already have such equipment, there will be a cost incurred to obtain it. It cannot be readily determined how much the cost may be, but it should be relatively minor.
