3. Committee: Commerce and Labor

4. Title: Enhanced Public Safety Telephone Services Act; CMRS resellers.

- **5. Summary:** The bill modifies the Enhanced Public Safety Telephone Services Act. It clarifies that Commercial Mobile Radio Service (CMRS) resellers are required to collect the wireless E-911 surcharge on all sales by retailers of prepaid CMRS service. The measure defines CMRS resellers as providers of mobile telecommunication services that resell, use a component part of, or integrate the purchased services into a mobile telecommunication service. An obsolete provision regarding payments for FY 2005 is deleted.
- 6. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Indeterminate.
- 7. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.
- 8. Fiscal Implications: The bill clarifies which wireless carriers are required to remit the Wireless E-911 Surcharge for prepaid wireless service and would serve to preclude any potential misunderstanding of the intent of the bill's requirements. It should be noted that staff of the Wireless E-911 Services Board is in the process of identifying any such providers. If any are identified, additional revenue may be collected and remitted to the Wireless E-911 Fund. Until this review is complete, it would not be prudent to make any projection as to the amount of revenue that may be recovered. Since this is simply a clarification of the existing requirement for collection of the surcharge, all wireless service providers should already be remitting in accordance with this change.
