4. Title: **Public schools; school board to report to Superintendent of Public Instruction recycling policies**

5. Summary: Requires each local school board to report to the Superintendent of Public Instruction any recycling policies voluntarily implemented or in place in any of its schools. The report shall include the types of items recycled, the number of schools participating in the recycling program, and an approximation of the amount of materials being recycled.

6. No Fiscal Impact: Preliminary. See item 8.

7. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

8. Fiscal Implications: This legislation requires local school divisions to submit a report annually to the Superintendent of Public Instruction detailing any recycling policies voluntarily implemented or in place in any of its schools. The report must include the types of items recycled, the number of schools participating in the recycling program, and an approximation of the amount of materials being recycled.

It is anticipated the new reporting requirement will have an administrative impact on local school divisions. Since the bill does not require any action by the Commonwealth on the information reported by school divisions, a fiscal impact to the state is not anticipated.
