- **5. Summary:** This bill eliminates the ability of the Department of Social Services to order 2.5 percent cash medical support payments from the noncustodial parent when the child is a recipient of Medicaid or the Family Access to Medical Insurance Security (FAMIS). The bill also terminates existing 2.5 percent payments and requires the department to repay any 2.5 percent payments received since July 1, 2009.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** Since July 1, 2009, the department has collected \$847.65 (associated with approximately ten cases) in medical support payments for children who receive Medicaid or FAMIS. This funding will be returned to the noncustodial parents under the provisions of this bill at a minimal cost to the Department of Social Services. The Department of Medical Assistance Services will not be impacted by this legislation.
