That § 10.1-563 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 12 § 10.1-563. Regulated land-disturbing activities; submission and approval of control plan. 13 A. Except as provided in § 10.1-564, no person may engage in any land-disturbing activity until he 14 has submitted to the district or locality an erosion and sediment control plan for the land-disturbing 15 activity and the plan has been reviewed and approved by the plan-approving authority. Where land-disturbing activities involve lands under the jurisdiction of more than one local control program an 16 erosion and sediment control plan may, at the option of the applicant, be submitted to the Board for 17 review and approval rather than to each jurisdiction concerned. Where the land-disturbing activity results 18 19 from the construction of a single-family residence, an agreement in lieu of a plan may be substituted for 20 an erosion and sediment control plan if executed by the plan-approving authority. 21 B. The plan-approving authority shall review conservation plans submitted to it and grant written approval within 45 days of the receipt of the plan if it determines that the plan meets the requirements 22 23 of the Board's regulations and if the person responsible for carrying out the plan certifies that he will 24 properly perform the conservation measures included in the plan and will conform to the provisions of 25 this article. In addition, as a prerequisite to engaging in the land-disturbing activities shown on the approved plan, the person responsible for carrying out the plan shall provide the name of an individual 26 27 holding a certificate of competence to the program authority, as provided by § 10.1-561, who will be in charge of and responsible for carrying out the land-disturbing activity. However, any plan-approving 28 29 authority may waive the certificate of competence requirement for an agreement in lieu of a plan for 30 construction of a single family residence. If a violation occurs during the land-disturbing activity, then

31 the person responsible for carrying out the agreement in lieu of a plan shall correct the violation and provide the name of an individual holding a certificate of competence, as provided by § 10.1-561. 32 33 Failure to provide the name of an individual holding a certificate of competence prior to engaging in 34 land-disturbing activities may result in revocation of the approval of the plan and the person responsible 35 for carrying out the plan shall be subject to the penalties provided in this article.

36 When a plan is determined to be inadequate, written notice of disapproval stating the specific reasons 37 for disapproval shall be communicated to the applicant within 45 days. The notice shall specify the modifications, terms and conditions that will permit approval of the plan. If no action is taken by the 38 39 plan-approving authority within the time specified above, the plan shall be deemed approved and the 40 person authorized to proceed with the proposed activity.

C. An approved plan may be changed by the authority that approved the plan in the following cases:

1. Where inspection has revealed that the plan is inadequate to satisfy applicable regulations; or

2. Where the person responsible for carrying out the approved plan finds that because of changed 43 44 circumstances or for other reasons the approved plan cannot be effectively carried out, and proposed amendments to the plan, consistent with the requirements of this article, are agreed to by the 45 46 plan-approving authority and the person responsible for carrying out the plan.

47 D. Electric, natural gas and telephone utility companies, interstate and intrastate natural gas pipeline companies and railroad companies shall, and public service authorities may, file general erosion and 48 49 sediment control specifications annually with the Board for review and approval. The specifications shall 50 apply to:

51 1. Construction, installation or maintenance of electric transmission, natural gas and, telephone utility 52 lines and pipelines, and water and sewer lines; and

53 2. Construction of the tracks, rights-of-way, bridges, communication facilities and other related 54 structures and facilities of the railroad company.

55 The Board shall have 60 days in which to approve the specifications. If no action is taken by the Board within 60 days, the specifications shall be deemed approved. Individual approval of separate 56 projects within subdivisions 1 and 2 of this subsection is not necessary when approved specifications are 57 58 followed. Projects not included in subdivisions 1 and 2 of this subsection shall comply with the

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requirements of the appropriate local erosion and sediment control program. The Board shall have the authority to enforce approved specifications.

61 E. Any person engaging, in more than one jurisdiction, in the creation and operation of wetland 62 mitigation or stream restoration banks, which have been approved and are operated in accordance with 63 applicable federal and state guidance, laws, or regulations for the establishment, use, and operation of 64 wetlands mitigation or stream restoration banks, pursuant to a mitigation banking instrument signed by 65 the Department of Environmental Quality, the Marine Resources Commission, or the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, may, at the option of that person, file general erosion and sediment control specifications 66 for wetland mitigation or stream restoration banks annually with the Board for review and approval 67 68 consistent with guidelines established by the Board.

The Board shall have 60 days in which to approve the specifications. If no action is taken by the 69 70 Board within 60 days, the specifications shall be deemed approved. Individual approval of separate 71 projects under this subsection is not necessary when approved specifications are implemented through a project-specific erosion and sediment control plan. Projects not included in this subsection shall comply 72 with the requirements of the appropriate local erosion and sediment control program. The Board shall 73 74 have the authority to enforce approved specifications. Approval of general erosion and sediment control 75 specifications by the Board does not relieve the owner or operator from compliance with any other local ordinances and regulations including requirements to submit plans and obtain permits as may be required 76 77 by such ordinances and regulations.

78 F. In order to prevent further erosion a local program may require approval of a conservation plan 79 for any land identified in the local program as an erosion impact area.

80 G. For the purposes of subsections A and B of this section, when land-disturbing activity will be 81 required of a contractor performing construction work pursuant to a construction contract, the

81 required of a contractor performing construction work pursuant to a construction contract, the
82 preparation, submission and approval of an erosion and sediment control plan shall be the responsibility
83 of the owner.
