11104815D 1 **HOUSE BILL NO. 1628** 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the House Committee on Militia, Police and Public Safety 4 on January 28, 2011) 5 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Watts) 6 A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 9.1-903, 9.1-905, and 9.1-906 of the Code of Virginia, relating to sex 7 offender registry; registration and reregistration. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 8 9 1. That §§ 9.1-903, 9.1-905, and 9.1-906 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 10 follows: 11 § 9.1-903. Registration procedures. A. Every person convicted, including juveniles tried and convicted in the circuit courts pursuant to 12 13 § 16.1-269.1, whether sentenced as an adult or juvenile, of an offense for which registration is required and every juvenile found delinquent of an offense for which registration is required under subsection G 14 15 of § 9.1-902 shall be required upon conviction to register and reregister with the Department of State Police. The court shall order the person to provide to the local law-enforcement agency of the county or 16 17 city where he physically resides all information required by the State Police for inclusion in the Registry. The court shall immediately remand the person to the custody of the local law-enforcement 18 agency for the purpose of obtaining the person's fingerprints and photographs of a type and kind 19 20 specified by the State Police for inclusion in the Registry. Upon conviction, the local law-enforcement 21 agency shall forthwith forward to the State Police all the necessary registration information. 22 B. Every person required to register shall register in person within three business days of his release 23 from confinement in a state, local or juvenile correctional facility, in a state civil commitment program 24 for sexually violent predators or, if a sentence of confinement is not imposed, within three business days 25 of suspension of the sentence or in the case of a juvenile of disposition. A person required to register shall register, and as part of the registration shall submit to be photographed, submit to have a sample of 26 27 his blood, saliva, or tissue taken for DNA (deoxyribonucleic acid) analysis and submission to the DNA 28 databank to determine identification characteristics specific to the person, provide electronic mail address 29 information, any instant message, chat or other Internet communication name or identity information that 30 the person uses or intends to use, submit to have his fingerprints and palm prints taken, provide information regarding his place of employment, and provide motor vehicle, watercraft and aircraft 31 32 registration information for all motor vehicles, watercraft and aircraft owned by him. The local law-enforcement agency shall obtain from the person who presents himself for registration or reregistration one set of fingerprints, electronic mail address information, any instant message, chat or 33 34 35 other Internet communication name or identity information that the person uses or intends to use, one 36 set of palm prints, place of employment information, motor vehicle, watercraft and aircraft registration 37 information for all motor vehicles, watercraft and aircraft owned by the registrant, proof of residency 38 and a photograph of a type and kind specified by the State Police for inclusion in the Registry and 39 advise the person of his duties regarding reregistration. The local law-enforcement agency shall obtain 40 from the person who presents himself for registration a sample of his blood, saliva or tissue taken for 41 DNA (deoxyribonucleic acid) analysis to determine identification characteristics specific to the person. If a sample has been previously taken from the person, as indicated by the Local Inmate Data System 42 (LIDS), no additional sample shall be taken. The local law-enforcement agency shall forthwith forward 43 to the State Police all necessary registration information. 44 C. To establish proof of residence in Virginia, a person who has a permanent physical address shall 45 present one photo-identification form issued by a governmental agency of the Commonwealth which

47 contains the person's complete name, gender, date of birth and complete physical address. The local
48 law-enforcement agency shall forthwith forward to the State Police a copy of the identification presented
49 by the person required to register.

D. Any person required to register shall also reregister in person with the local law-enforcement 50 51 agency following any change of name or any change of residence, whether within or without the Commonwealth. If his new residence is within the Commonwealth, the person shall register in person 52 53 with the local law-enforcement agency where his new residence is located within three business days 54 following his change in residence. If the new residence is located outside of the Commonwealth, the person shall register in person with the local law-enforcement agency where he previously registered 55 within 10 days prior to his change of residence. If a probation or parole officer becomes aware of a 56 change of name or residence for any of his probationers or parolees required to register, the probation or 57 parole officer shall notify the State Police forthwith of learning of the change. Whenever a person 58 59 subject to registration changes residence to another state, the State Police shall notify the designated

law-enforcement agency of that state. 60

61 E. Any person required to register shall reregister in person with the local law-enforcement agency 62 where his residence is located within three business days following any change of the place of 63 employment, whether within or without the Commonwealth. If a probation or parole officer becomes 64 aware of a change of the place of employment for any of his probationers or parolees required to 65 register, the probation or parole officer shall notify the State Police forthwith upon learning of the 66 change of the person's place of employment. Whenever a person subject to registration changes his place of employment to another state, the State Police shall notify the designated law-enforcement agency of 67 68 that state.

69 F. Any person required to register shall reregister in person with the local law-enforcement agency 70 where his residence is located within three *business* days following any change of owned motor vehicle, watercraft and aircraft registration information, whether within or without the Commonwealth. If a 71 72 probation or parole officer becomes aware of a change of owned motor vehicle, watercraft and aircraft registration information for any of his probationers or parolees required to register, the probation or 73 parole officer shall notify the State Police forthwith upon learning of the change of the person's owned 74 75 motor vehicle, watercraft and aircraft registration information. Whenever a person required to register 76 changes his owned motor vehicle, watercraft and aircraft registration information to another state, the State Police shall notify the designated law-enforcement agency of that state. 77

78 G. Any person required to register shall reregister either in person or electronically with the local 79 law-enforcement agency where his residence is located within 30 minutes following any change of the 80 electronic mail address information, any instant message, chat or other Internet communication name or identity information that the person uses or intends to use, whether within or without the Commonwealth. For purposes of determining compliance with this requirement, if reregistration is sent 81 82 83 electronically, the reregistration shall be deemed to have occurred when the electronic message was sent 84 by the person required to register, and not when it was received or opened by the law-enforcement agency. If a probation or parole officer becomes aware of a change of the electronic mail address 85 86 information, any instant message, chat or other Internet communication name or identity information for 87 any of his probationers or parolees required to register, the probation or parole officer shall notify the 88 State Police forthwith upon learning of the change. For purposes of the registration required by this 89 subsection, the local law-enforcement agency shall make available a 24-hour telephone access number 90 and an electronic mail address to any person required to reregister following any change of the 91 electronic mail address information, any instant message, chat or other Internet communication name or 92 identity information that the person uses or intends to use. The local law-enforcement agency shall 93 provide and update as needed the telephone number and electronic mail address to the Department of 94 State Police for inclusion on the State Police website.

95 H. The registration shall be maintained in the Registry and shall include the person's name, all 96 aliases that he has used or under which he may have been known, the date and locality of the 97 conviction for which registration is required, his fingerprints and a photograph of a type and kind 98 specified by the State Police, his date of birth, social security number, current physical and mailing 99 address and a description of the offense or offenses for which he was convicted. The registration shall 100 also include the locality of the conviction and a description of the offense or offenses for previous convictions for the offenses set forth in § 9.1-902. 101

102 I. The local law-enforcement agency shall forthwith forward to the State Police all necessary registration or reregistration information received by it. Upon receipt of registration or reregistration 103 information the State Police shall forthwith notify the chief law-enforcement officer of the locality listed 104 105 as the person's address on the registration and reregistration.

J. If a person required to register does not have a legal residence, such person shall designate a 106 location that can be located with reasonable specificity where he resides or habitually locates himself. For the purposes of this section, "residence" shall include such a designated location. If the person 107 108 109 wishes to change such designated location, he shall do it pursuant to the terms of this section. 110

§ 9.1-905. New residents and nonresident offenders; registration required.

111 A. All persons required to register shall register within three *business* days of establishing a residence 112 in the Commonwealth.

113 B. Nonresident offenders entering the Commonwealth for an extended visit, for employment, to carry 114 on a vocation, or as a student attending school who are required to register in their state of residence or 115 who would be required to register if a resident of the Commonwealth shall, within three business days 116 of entering the Commonwealth for an extended visit, accepting employment or enrolling in school in the Commonwealth, be required to register and reregister in person with the local law-enforcement agency. 117

C. To document employment or school attendance in Virginia, a person shall present proof of 118 119 enrollment as a student or suitable proof of temporary employment in the Commonwealth and one photo-identification form issued by a governmental agency of the person's state of residence which 120 contains the person's complete name, gender, date of birth and complete address. 121

122 D. For purposes of this section:

123 "Employment" and "carry on a vocation" include employment that is full-time or part-time for a 124 period of time exceeding 14 days or for an aggregate period of time exceeding 30 days during any 125 calendar year, whether financially compensated, volunteered, or for the purpose of government or 126 educational benefit.

127 "Extended visit" means a period of visitation for any purpose in the Commonwealth of 30 days or 128 more.

129 "Student" means a person who is enrolled on a full-time or part-time basis, in any public or private 130 educational institution, including any secondary school, trade or professional institution, or institution of 131 higher education. 132

§ 9.1-906. Enrollment or employment at institution of higher learning; information required.

133 A. Persons required to register or reregister who are enrolled in or employed at institutions of higher 134 learning shall, in addition to other registration requirements, indicate on their registration and 135 reregistration form the name and location of the institution attended by or employing the registrant 136 whether such institution is within or without the Commonwealth. In addition, persons required to register 137 or reregister shall notify the local law-enforcement agency in person within three business days of any 138 change in their enrollment or employment status with an institution of higher learning. The local 139 law-enforcement agency shall forthwith forward to the State Police all necessary registration or 140 reregistration information received by it.

141 B. Upon receipt of a registration or reregistration indicating enrollment or employment with an 142 institute of higher learning or notification of a change in status, the State Police shall notify the chief 143 law-enforcement officer of the institution's law-enforcement agency or, if there is no institutional 144 law-enforcement agency, the local law-enforcement agency serving that institution, of the registration, 145 reregistration, or change in status. The law-enforcement agency receiving notification under this section 146 shall make such information available upon request.

147 C. For purposes of this section:

"Employment" includes full- or part-time, temporary or permanent or contractual employment at an 148 149 institution of higher learning either with or without compensation.

150 "Enrollment" includes both full- and part-time.

151 "Institution of higher learning" means any post-secondary school, trade or professional institution, or 152 institution of higher education.

2. That every local police department and sheriff's office in the Commonwealth shall furnish to 153 154 the Department of State Police their designated telephone number and electronic mail address for 155 purposes of complying with subsection G of § 9.1-903 of the Code of Virginia by September 1,
