2	AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
3	(Proposed by the House Committee for Courts of Justice

6	A BILL to provide specialty treatment procedures for veterans and military servicemembers.
7	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
8	<b>1.</b> § 1. That localities may establish for veterans and military servicemembers special treatment
9	procedures.
10	A. For purposes of this section, "servicemember" means a person who is presently serving in the
11	armed forces of the United States, or a reserve component thereof, including the National Guard. For
12	purposes of this section, "veteran" means a person who has served in the armed forces of the United
13	States, including the U.S. Coast Guard, or a reserve component of the armed forces of the United
14	States, including the National Guard.
15	B. Localities may establish policies and procedures for servicemembers who are nonviolent offenders
16	to attain the following goals: (i) effective coordination of treatment and counseling services available to
17	the criminal justice system; (ii) enhanced public safety through intensive offender supervision,
18	counseling, and treatment; (iii) prompt identification and placement of eligible participants; (iv) efficient
19	access to a continuum of treatment, rehabilitation, and counseling services; (v) where appropriate,
20	verified participant abstinence through frequent alcohol and other drug testing; (vi) prompt response to
21	participants' noncompliance with program requirements; (vii) ongoing monitoring and evaluation of
22	program effectiveness and efficiency; (viii) ongoing education and training in support of program
23	effectiveness and efficiency; (ix) ongoing collaboration among public agencies, community-based
24	organizations and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs' health care networks, the Veterans Benefits
25	Administration, volunteer veteran mentors, and veteran and military family support organizations; and
26	(x) creation of a veterans and military servicemembers advisory council to provide input on the
27	operations of programs. The council shall include individuals responsible for the special procedures
28	program along with veterans and, if available, military servicemembers.
29	C. The Department of Veterans Services shall cooperate with localities in accomplishing the purposes
30	of this section.
