That § 46.2-320 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 12 § 46.2-320. Other grounds for refusal or suspension. 13 A. The Department may refuse to grant an application for a driver's license in any of the 14 circumstances set forth in § 46.2-608 as circumstances justifying the refusal of an application for the 15 registration of a motor vehicle. The Department may refuse to issue or reissue a driver's license for the 16 willful failure or refusal to pay any taxes or fees required to be collected or authorized to be collected 17 by the Department. 18 B. The Commissioner may enter into an agreement with the Department of Social Services whereby 19 the Department may suspend or refuse to renew the driver's license of any person upon receipt of notice 20 from the Department of Social Services that the person (i) is delinquent in the payment of child support 21 by 90 days or more or in an amount of \$5,000 or more or (ii) has failed to comply with a subpoena, 22 summons or warrant relating to paternity or child support proceedings. A suspension or refusal to renew 23 authorized pursuant to this section shall not be effective until 30 days after service on the delinquent 24 obligor of notice of intent to suspend or refuse to renew. The notice of intent shall be served on the 25 obligor by the Department of Social Services (i)(a) by certified mail, return receipt requested, sent to the 26 obligor's last known addresses as shown in the records of the Department or the Department of Social 27 Services or (ii)(b) pursuant to § 8.01-296, or (iii)(c) service may be waived by the obligor in accordance 28 with procedures established by the Department of Social Services. The obligor shall be entitled to a 29 judicial hearing if a request for a hearing is made, in writing, to the Department of Social Services 30 within 10 days from service of the notice of intent. Upon receipt of the request for a hearing, the 31 Department of Social Services shall petition the court that entered or is enforcing the order, requesting a hearing on the proposed suspension or refusal to renew. The court shall authorize the suspension or 32 33 refusal to renew only if it finds that the obligor's noncompliance with the child support order was willful. Upon a showing by the Department of Social Services that the obligor is delinquent in the payment of child support by 90 days or more or in an amount of \$5,000 or more, the burden of proving 34 35 that the delinquency was not willful shall rest upon the obligor. The Department shall not suspend or 36 37 refuse to renew the driver's license until a final determination is made by the court. 38 C. At any time after service of a notice of intent, the person may petition the juvenile and domestic 39 relations district court in the jurisdiction where he resides for the issuance of a restricted license to be used if the suspension or refusal to renew becomes effective. Upon such petition and a finding of good

40 41 cause, the court may provide that such person be issued a restricted permit to operate a motor vehicle for any of the purposes set forth in subsection E of § 18.2-271.1. A restricted license issued pursuant to 42 this subsection shall not permit any person to operate a commercial motor vehicle as defined in 43 § 46.2-341.4. The court shall order the surrender of the person's license to operate a motor vehicle, to be 44 disposed of in accordance with the provisions of § 46.2-398, and shall forward to the Commissioner a 45 46 copy of its order entered pursuant to this subsection. The order shall specifically enumerate the 47 restrictions imposed and contain such information regarding the person to whom such a permit is issued 48 as is reasonably necessary to identify him.

49 D. The Department shall not renew a driver's license or terminate a license suspension imposed 50 pursuant to this section until it has received from the Department of Social Services a certification that 51 the person has (i) paid the delinquency in full; (ii) reached an agreement with the Department of Social 52 Services to satisfy the delinquency within a period not to exceed 10 years and at least one payment, 53 representing at least five percent of the total delinquency or 500 1,000, whichever is greater, has been made pursuant to the agreement; (iii) complied with a subpoena, summons or warrant relating to a 54 55 paternity or child support proceeding; or (iv) completed or is successfully participating in an intensive case monitoring program for child support ordered by a juvenile and domestic relations district court for 56 noncustodial parents, as determined by the court. Certification by the Department of Social Services 57 58 shall be made by electronic or telephonic communication and shall be made on the same work day that

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59 payment required by clause (i) or (ii) is made.

60 E. If a person who has entered into an agreement with the Department of Social Services pursuant 61 to clause (ii) of subsection D fails to comply with the requirements of the agreement, the Department of 62 Social Services shall notify the Department of the person's noncompliance and the Department shall 63 suspend or refuse to renew the driver's license of the person unless the person enters into a subsequent 64 agreement with the Department of Social Services to satisfy the delinquency within a period not to exceed 10 years, and has made at least one payment of \$2,500 or five percent of the total delinquency, 65 whichever is greater, pursuant to the agreement. If the person fails to comply with the terms of a 66 subsequent agreement reached with the Department of Social Services pursuant to this section, without 67 further notice to the person as provided in the subsequent agreement, the Department of Social Services **68** shall notify the Department of the person's noncompliance and the Department shall suspend or refuse 69 70 to renew the driver's license of the person. A person who has failed to comply with the terms of a 71 second or subsequent agreement pursuant to this subsection may be granted a new agreement with the Department of Social Services if the person pays 25 percent of the total delinquency if \$20,000 or more 72 is owed, or 50 percent of the total delinquency if less than \$20,000 is owed, and agrees to a repayment 73 74 schedule of not more than 10 years. Upon satisfaction of these conditions, the Department shall issue a 75 driver's license to the person or reinstate the person's driver's license.
