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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 46.2-320 of the Code of Virginia, relating to driver's license; suspension 3 for failure to pay child support.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6

7 1. That § 46.2-320 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 46.2-320. Other grounds for refusal or suspension.

9 A. The Department may refuse to grant an application for a driver's license in any of the 10 circumstances set forth in § 46.2-608 as circumstances justifying the refusal of an application for the registration of a motor vehicle. The Department may refuse to issue or reissue a driver's license for the 11 12 willful failure or refusal to pay any taxes or fees required to be collected or authorized to be collected 13 by the Department.

B. The Commissioner may enter into an agreement with the Department of Social Services whereby 14 15 the Department may suspend or refuse to renew the driver's license of any person upon receipt of notice from the Department of Social Services that the person (i) is delinquent in the payment of child support 16 17 by 90 days or more or in an amount of \$5,000 or more or (ii) has failed to comply with a subpoena, summons or warrant relating to paternity or child support proceedings. A suspension or refusal to renew 18 19 authorized pursuant to this section shall not be effective until 30 days after service on the delinquent 20 obligor of notice of intent to suspend or refuse to renew. The notice of intent shall be served on the 21 obligor by the Department of Social Services (i) (a) by certified mail, return receipt requested, sent to the obligor's last known addresses as shown in the records of the Department or the Department of 22 23 Social Services or (ii) (b) pursuant to § 8.01-296, or (iii) (c) service may be waived by the obligor in 24 accordance with procedures established by the Department of Social Services. The obligor shall be 25 entitled to a judicial hearing if a request for a hearing is made, in writing, to the Department of Social 26 Services within 10 days from service of the notice of intent. Upon receipt of the request for a hearing, 27 the Department of Social Services shall petition the court that entered or is enforcing the order, 28 requesting a hearing on the proposed suspension or refusal to renew. The court shall authorize the 29 suspension or refusal to renew only if it finds that the obligor's noncompliance with the child support 30 order was willful. Upon a showing by the Department of Social Services that the obligor is delinquent in the payment of child support by 90 days or more or in an amount of \$5,000 or more, the burden of 31 32 proving that the delinquency was not willful shall rest upon the obligor. The Department shall not 33 suspend or refuse to renew the driver's license until a final determination is made by the court.

34 C. At any time after service of a notice of intent, the person may petition the juvenile and domestic 35 relations district court in the jurisdiction where he resides for the issuance of a restricted license to be used if the suspension or refusal to renew becomes effective. Upon such petition and a finding of good 36 37 cause, the court may provide that such person be issued a restricted permit to operate a motor vehicle 38 for any of the purposes set forth in subsection E of § 18.2-271.1. A restricted license issued pursuant to 39 this subsection shall not permit any person to operate a commercial motor vehicle as defined in 40 § 46.2-341.4. The court shall order the surrender of the person's license to operate a motor vehicle, to be 41 disposed of in accordance with the provisions of § 46.2-398, and shall forward to the Commissioner a 42 copy of its order entered pursuant to this subsection. The order shall specifically enumerate the 43 restrictions imposed and contain such information regarding the person to whom such a permit is issued 44 as is reasonably necessary to identify him.

45 D. The Department shall not renew a driver's license or terminate a license suspension imposed pursuant to this section until it has received from the Department of Social Services a certification that 46 47 the person has (i) paid the delinquency in full; (ii) reached an agreement with the Department of Social Services to satisfy the delinquency within a period not to exceed 10 years and at least one payment, 48 representing at least five percent of the total delinquency or \$500 \$600, whichever is greater, has been 49 50 made pursuant to the agreement; (iii) complied with a subpoena, summons or warrant relating to a paternity or child support proceeding; or (iv) completed or is successfully participating in an intensive 51 case monitoring program for child support ordered by a juvenile and domestic relations district court for 52 53 noncustodial parents, as determined by the court. Certification by the Department of Social Services 54 shall be made by electronic or telephonic communication and shall be made on the same work day that 55 payment required by clause (i) or (ii) is made.

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56 E. If a person who has entered into an agreement with the Department of Social Services pursuant 2 of 2

to clause (ii) of subsection D fails to comply with the requirements of the agreement, the Department of 57 58 Social Services shall notify the Department of the person's noncompliance and the Department shall 59 suspend or refuse to renew the driver's license of the person until it has received from the Department 60 of Social Services a certification that the person has paid the delinquency in full or has entered into a 61 subsequent agreement with the Department of Social Services to satisfy the delinquency within a period 62 not to exceed 7 years and has made at least one payment of \$1,200 or five percent of the total delinquency, whichever is greater, pursuant to the agreement. If the person fails to comply with the 63 terms of a subsequent agreement reached with the Department of Social Services pursuant to this 64 65 section, without further notice to the person as provided in the subsequent agreement, the Department of 66 Social Services shall notify the Department of the person's noncompliance and the Department shall suspend or refuse to renew the driver's license of the person. A person who has failed to comply with 67 the terms of a second or subsequent agreement pursuant to this subsection may be granted a new **68** agreement with the Department of Social Services if the person has made at least one payment of 69 70 \$1,800 or five percent of the total delinquency, whichever is greater, and agrees to a repayment 71 schedule of not more than 7 years. Upon receipt of certification from the Department of Social Services 72 of the person's satisfaction of these conditions, the Department shall issue a driver's license to the 73 person or reinstate the person's driver's license. Certification by the Department of Social Services shall 74 be made by electronic or telephonic communication and shall be made on the same work day that 75 payment required by this subsection is made.
