6	A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 33.1-23.05, 33.1-23.4:01, 33.1-268, 33.1-269, 33.1-276, 33.1-277, and
7	33.1-280 of the Code of Virginia; to amend and reenact § 2 of the second enactment of Chapter 896
8	of the Acts of Assembly of 2007; and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 1 of Title
9	33.1 an article numbered 1.2, consisting of sections numbered 33.1-23.6 through 33.1-23.13, and an
10	article numbered 1.3, consisting of sections numbered 33.1-23.14 through 33.1-23.26, and by adding
11 12	a section numbered 33.1-221.1:1.3, relating to transportation funding. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
13	1. That §§ 33.1-23.05, 33.1-23.4:01, 33.1-268, 33.1-269, 33.1-276, 33.1-277, and 33.1-280 of the Code
14	of Virginia are amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in
15	Chapter 1 of Title 33.1 an article numbered 1.2, consisting of sections numbered 33.1-23.6 through
16	33.1-23.13, and an article numbered 1.3, consisting of sections numbered 33.1-23.14 through
17	33.1-23.26, and by adding a section numbered 33.1-221.1:1.3 as follows:
18 19	§ 33.1-23.05. Revenue-sharing funds for systems in certain counties, cities, and towns. A. From revenues made available by the General Assembly after January 1, 2008, and appropriated
20	for the improvement, construction, or reconstruction of the systems of state highways, the
21	Commonwealth Transportation Board shall may make an equivalent matching allocation to any county,
22	city, or town for designations by the governing body of up to \$1 \$10 million in county, city, or town
23	general funds for use by the county, city, or town to improve, construct, or reconstruct the highway
24 25	systems within such county, city, or town. After adopting a resolution supporting the action, the governing body may request revenue-sharing funds to improve, construct, or reconstruct a highway
2 6	system located in another locality, between two or more localities, or to bring subdivision streets, used
2 7	as such prior to July 1, 1992 the date specified in § 33.1-72.1, up to standards sufficient to qualify them
28	for inclusion in the state primary and secondary system of highways. All requests for funding shall be
29	accompanied by a prioritized listing of specified projects.
30 31	B. The allocation of funds to localities shall be only for the purposes set forth in subsection A. In allocating funds under this section, the Board shall give priority (i) first when such project is
32	administered by the county, city, or town, either directly or by contract with another entity, (ii) second,
33	when such county, city, or town commits more local funding than the amount of revenue-sharing
34	funding requested, and (iii) third when the allocation will accelerate an existing project in the Six-Year
35	Improvement Program or the locality's capital plans. Any funds remaining may be applied to any other
36 37	project that requires an equivalent matching allocation from the governing body C. The Department will contract with the county, city, or town for the implementation of the project
38	or projects. Such contract may cover either a single project or may provide for the locality's
39	implementation of several projects during the fiscal year. The county, city, or town will undertake
40	implementation of the particular project or projects by obtaining the necessary permits from the
41	Department of Transportation in order to ensure that the improvement is consistent with the
42 43	Department's standards for such improvements. At the request of the locality, the Department may provide the locality with engineering, right-of-way acquisition, and/or construction services for a project
44	with its own forces. The locality shall provide payment to the Department for any such services. If
45	administered by the Department, such contract shall also require that the governing body pay to the
46	Department within 30 days the local revenue-sharing funds from its general fund upon written notice by
47	the Department of its intent to proceed. Any project having funds allocated under this program shall be
48 49	initiated in such a fashion where at least a portion of such funds have been expended within two subsequent fiscal years of allocation. Any revenue-sharing funds for projects not initiated after two
50	subsequent fiscal years of allocation may be reallocated at the discretion of the Commonwealth
51	Transportation Board.
52	D. Total Commonwealth funds allocated by the Board under this section shall not exceed \$50 \$200
53 54	million in any one fiscal year and no less than \$15 million each fiscal year, subject to appropriation for
54 55	E. No more than three months prior to the end of any fiscal year in which less than the full program
56	allocation has been allocated by the Board to specific governing bodies, those localities requesting the
57	maximum allocation under subsection A may be allowed an additional allocation The funds allocated by
58	the Commonwealth Transportation Board under this section shall be distributed and administered in
59	accordance with the revenue-sharing program guidelines established by the Board.

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60 § 33.1-23.4:01. Allocation of proceeds of Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Capital Projects 61 Revenue Bonds.

The Commonwealth Transportation Board shall allocate, use, and distribute the proceeds of any 62 63 bonds it is authorized to issue on or after July 1, 2007, pursuant to subdivision 4f of § 33.1-269, as 64 follows:

65 1. A minimum of 20% 20 percent of the bond proceeds shall be used for transit capital consistent 66 with subdivision A 4 g of § 58.1-638.

2. A minimum of $\frac{4.3\%}{4.3}$ 4.3 percent of the bond proceeds shall be used for rail capital consistent with 67 68 the provisions of §§ 33.1-221.1:1.1 and 33.1-221.1:1.2.

69 $\hat{3}$. The remaining amount of bond proceeds shall be used for paying the costs incurred or to be 70 incurred for construction of transportation projects with such bond proceeds used or allocated as follows: (a) (i) first, to match federal highway funds projected to be made available and allocated to highway and 71 public transportation capital projects to the extent determined by the Commonwealth Transportation 72 73 Board, for purposes of allowing additional state construction funds to be allocated to the primary, urban, and secondary systems of highways pursuant to subdivisions B 1, B 2, and B 3 of § 33.1-23.1; (b) (ii) 74 75 next, to provide any required funding to fulfill the Commonwealth's allocation of equivalent revenue sharing matching funds pursuant to § 33.1-23.05 to the extent determined by the Commonwealth 76 77 Transportation Board; and (e) (iii) third, to pay or fund the costs of statewide or regional projects 78 throughout the Commonwealth. Costs incurred or to be incurred for construction or funding of these 79 transportation projects shall include, but are not limited to, environmental and engineering studies, 80 rights-of-way acquisition, improvements to all modes of transportation, acquisition, construction and related improvements, and any financing costs or other financing expenses relating to such bonds. Such 81 costs may include the payment of interest on such bonds for a period during construction and not 82 83 exceeding one year after completion of construction of the relevant project.

4. The total amount of bonds authorized shall be used for purposes of applying the percentages in 84 85 subdivisions 1 through 3. 86

Article 1.2.

Virginia Transportation Infrastructure Bank.

§ 33.1-23.6. Legislative findings and purposes.

89 The General Assembly finds that there exists in the Commonwealth a critical need for additional 90 sources of funding to finance the present and future needs of the Commonwealth for the design and 91 construction of roads and highways, including toll facilities, mass transit, freight and commuter rail, 92 including rolling stock, port, and other transportation facilities. This need can be alleviated in part 93 through the creation of a transportation infrastructure bank. The purpose of such bank is to encourage the investment of both public and private funds and to make loans and other financial assistance 94 available to localities, private entities, and other eligible borrowers to finance eligible transportation 95 projects. The General Assembly determines that the creation of a transportation infrastructure bank for 96 this purpose is in the public interest, serves a public purpose, and will promote the health, safety, 97 98 welfare, convenience, or prosperity of the people of the Commonwealth. 99

§ 33.1-23.7. Definitions.

100 As used in this article, unless the context requires a different meaning:

101 "Bank" means the Virginia Transportation Infrastructure Bank created in § 33.1-23.8.

102 "Cost," as applied to any project financed under the provisions of this article, means the total of all 103 costs including, but not limited to, the costs of planning, design, right-of-way acquisition, engineering, and construction incurred by an eligible borrower or other project sponsor as reasonable and necessary 104 105 for carrying out all works and undertakings necessary or incident to the accomplishment of any project. The term also includes capitalized interest, reasonably required reserve funds, and financing, credit 106 107 enhancement, and issuance costs.

"Credit enhancements" means surety bonds, insurance policies, letters of credit, guarantees, and 108 109 other forms of collateral or security.

110 "Creditworthiness" means attributes such as revenue stability, debt service coverage, reserves, and 111 other factors commonly considered in assessing the strength of the security for indebtedness.

112 "Eligible borrower" means any (i) private entity; (ii) locality; (iii) local, regional, state, or federal 113 entity or transportation authority, planning district, commission, or political subdivision created by the 114 General Assembly or pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth; (iv) metropolitan planning organization; (v) entity established by interstate compact; (vi) instrumentality, corporation, or 115 116 entity established by any of the foregoing or any project sponsor pursuant to § 33.1-23.11; or (vii) 117 combination of two or more of the foregoing.

"Loan" means an obligation subject to repayment that is provided by the Bank to an eligible 118 119 borrower for all or a part of the eligible cost of a project incurred by an eligible borrower or a project 120 sponsor. A loan may be disbursed in anticipation of reimbursement for (including an advance or draw under a credit enhancement instrument) or direct payment of eligible costs of a project. 121

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122 "Locality" means any county, city, or town in the Commonwealth.

"Management agreement" means the memorandum of understanding or interagency agreement
 between the Virginia Resources Authority and the Commonwealth Transportation Board as authorized
 under subsection B of § 33.1-23.8.

"Manager" means the Virginia Resources Authority serving as the manager and administrator of the
 Bank in accordance with the provisions of this article and the management agreement.

128 "Other financial assistance" means, but is not limited to, grants, interest rate subsidies, capital or
129 debt reserves for bonds or debt instrument financing, provision of letters of credit and other forms of
130 credit enhancement, and other lawful forms of financing and methods of leveraging funds that are
131 approved by the Manager.

132 "Private entity" means any private or nongovernmental entity that has executed an interim or
 133 comprehensive agreement to develop and construct a transportation infrastructure project pursuant to
 134 the Public-Private Transportation Act of 1995 (§ 56-556 et seq.).

135 "Project" means (i) the construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, or replacement of any interstate,
136 state highway, toll road, tunnel, local road, bridge, or runway or (ii) the construction, reconstruction,
137 rehabilitation, replacement, or acquisition of any transit and passenger or freight rail facility or vehicle.

138 "Project obligation" means any bonds, notes, debentures, interim certificates, grant or revenue
139 anticipation notes, leases or lease-purchase or installment sales agreements, or credit enhancements
140 issued, incurred, or entered into by an eligible borrower or project sponsor to evidence or guarantee a
141 loan or any financing agreements, reimbursement agreements, or other evidences of an obligation of an

142 eligible borrower or a project sponsor for the payment or guarantee of a loan.

143 "Project sponsor" means any eligible borrower and any other governmental or nongovernmental
144 entity that is involved in the construction, maintenance, and financing of a project for which a loan is
145 made.

146 "Reliable repayment source" means any means by which an eligible borrower or project sponsor147 generates funds that are dedicated to the purpose of retiring a project obligation.

148 "Substantial project completion" means the opening of a project for vehicular or passenger traffic or
 149 the handling of cargo and freight.

150 § 33.1-23.8. Creation of the Virginia Transportation Infrastructure Bank.

151 A. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting, revolving loan fund that is a 152 subfund of the Transportation Trust Fund, known as the Virginia Transportation Infrastructure Bank. 153 The Bank shall be established on the books of the Comptroller. The Bank shall be capitalized as 154 recommended by the Governor, and appropriated by the General Assembly, and the appropriations shall 155 be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Bank. Repayment of loans and interest earned on the 156 moneys in the Bank shall be credited to the Bank. Any moneys remaining in the Bank, including interest 157 thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Bank. 158 The Bank shall be managed and administered by the Manager subject to certain specific rights of the 159 Commonwealth Transportation Board as set forth in this article or as may be set forth in the 160 management agreement. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth in this article or in the 161 management agreement, the Commonwealth Transportation Board shall have the right to determine the 162 projects for which loans or other financial assistance may be provided by the Bank. Moneys in the Bank 163 shall be used solely for the purposes enumerated in subsections C and D.

164 B. The Commonwealth Transportation Board and the Virginia Resources Authority are authorized to 165 enter into a management agreement under which the Virginia Resources Authority will manage and 166 administer the Bank, which may include provisions (i) setting forth the terms and conditions under which the Virginia Resources Authority will advise the Commonwealth Transportation Board on the 167 168 financial propriety of providing loans or other financial assistance to prospective eligible borrowers or other project sponsors, (ii) setting forth the terms and conditions under which the substantive 169 requirements of subsections C through F and § 33.1-23.11 will be applied and administered, and (iii) 170 171 authorizing the Virginia Resources Authority to disburse from the moneys in or payable to the Bank the 172 reasonable costs and expenses the Virginia Resources Authority may incur in the management and 173 administration of the Bank and a reasonable fee to be approved by the Commonwealth Transportation 174 Board for the Virginia Resources Authority's management and administrative services.

175 C. 1. Moneys deposited in the Bank shall be used for the purpose of making loans and other 176 financial assistance to finance projects.

177 2. Each project obligation shall be payable, in whole or in part, from reliable revenue sources178 pledged for such purpose.

179 3. The interest rate on a project obligation, if any, shall be determined by reference to the current market rates for comparable obligations, the nature of the project and the financing structure therefor, and the creditworthiness of the eligible borrower and any other project sponsors.

182 4. The repayment schedule for each project obligation shall require the amortization of principal

183 beginning no later than five years following substantial project completion and a final maturity date of 184 not more than 35 years following substantial project completion.

D. A portion that is not less than 20 percent of the capitalization of the Bank shall be used for 185 186 grants or interest rate subsidies to localities to finance projects.

187 E. The pledge of reliable revenue sources and other property securing any project obligation may be 188 subordinate to the pledge securing any other senior debt obligations incurred to finance the project.

189 F. Notwithstanding subdivision C 4, the Manager may at any time following substantial project 190 completion reduce, defer, or cancel payments on a project obligation if the project is unable to generate 191 sufficient revenues to pay the scheduled payments.

192 G. No loan or other financial assistance may be provided or committed to be provided by the Bank in a manner that would cause such loan or other financial assistance to be tax-supported debt within 193 194 the meaning of § 2.2-2713 or be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a 195 pledge of the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth but shall be payable solely from legally 196 available moneys held by the Bank.

197 H. The Bank is not authorized or empowered to be or to constitute a bank or trust company within 198 the jurisdiction or under the control of the Commonwealth or an agency thereof or the Comptroller of 199 Currency of the U.S. Treasury Department; or a bank, banker, or dealer in securities within the 200 meaning of, or subject to the provisions of, any securities, securities exchange, or securities dealers law 201 of the United States or of the Commonwealth.

202 I. The Commonwealth Transportation Board or the Manager may direct the Comptroller to establish federal and state accounts or subaccounts as may be necessary to meet any applicable federal law 203 204 requirements or desirable for the efficient administration of the Bank in accordance with this article. 205

§ 33.1-23.9. Eligibility and project selection.

206 A. Any entity constituting an eligible borrower or a project sponsor is eligible to apply for a loan or 207 other financial assistance from the Bank to finance a project.

208 B. Notwithstanding subsection A, only localities are eligible to apply for a grant or an interest rate 209 subsidy from the Bank.

210 C. All applicants for a loan must file an application with the Manager, which must include all items 211 determined by the Manager to be necessary and appropriate for the Commonwealth Transportation 212 Board to determine whether or not to approve the loan, including the availability of reliable repayment 213 sources to retire the project obligation as well as creditworthiness.

214 D. Any locality applying for a grant or interest rate subsidy must demonstrate, among other things 215 as determined by the Manager, that the project cannot be financed on reasonable terms or would 216 otherwise be financially infeasible without the grant or interest rate subsidy.

217 E. Each applicant for a loan or other financial assistance must demonstrate that the project is of 218 local, regional, or statewide significance and meets the goal of generating economic benefits, improving 219 air quality, reducing congestion, or improving safety through enhancement of the state transportation 220 network. Another criterion to be considered is whether or not the loan or other financial assistance will 221 enable the project to be completed at an earlier date than otherwise feasible.

222 F. All projects for which a loan or other financial assistance is provided must meet and remain in 223 compliance with the policies and guidelines established by the Commonwealth Transportation Board and 224 the Virginia Resources Authority. 225

§ 33.1-23.10. Grants from the Commonwealth Transportation Board.

226 The Commonwealth Transportation Board may make grants of money or property to the Bank for the 227 purpose of enabling it to carry out its corporate purposes and for the exercise of its powers. This 228 section shall not be construed to limit any other power the Commonwealth Transportation Board may 229 have to make grants to the Bank. 230

§ 33.1-23.11. Acquisition of project obligations.

231 A. The Manager shall have the power and authority to cause the Bank to purchase or otherwise 232 acquire, on terms as defined by the Manager, project obligations to evidence or guarantee loans or 233 other financial assistance (which for purposes of this section shall not include grants and interest rate 234 subsidies) provided to finance or refinance the costs of any project. The Manager may also sell any 235 project obligations so acquired and apply the proceeds of such a sale to the making of additional loans 236 and the provision of other financial assistance for financing or refinancing the cost of any project or for 237 any other corporate purpose of the Bank.

238 B. The Manager may require, as a condition to provision of a loan or other financial assistance and 239 the acquisition of any project obligations, that the eligible borrower or other project sponsor or 240 sponsors covenant to perform any of the following:

241 1. Establish and collect tolls, rents, rates, fees, and other charges to produce revenue sufficient to 242 pay all or a specified portion of (i) the costs of operation, maintenance, replacement, renewal, and 243 repairs of the project; (ii) any outstanding indebtedness incurred for the purposes of the project, 244 including the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the project obligations; and (iii) any

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245 amounts necessary to create and maintain any required reserve, including any rate stabilization fund 246 deemed necessary or appropriate by the Manager to offset the need, in whole or part, for future 247 increases in tolls, rents, rates, fees, or charges;

248 2. Create and maintain a special fund or funds as security for or the source of the scheduled 249 payments on the project obligations or for the operation, maintenance, repair, or replacement of the 250 project or any portions thereof or other property of the eligible borrower or other project sponsors, and 251 deposit into any fund or funds amounts sufficient to make any payments as they become due and 252 payable; 253

3. Create and maintain other special funds as required by the Manager; and

254 4. Perform other acts, including the conveyance or mortgaging of real and personal property 255 together with all right, title, and interest therein to secure project obligations, or take other actions as 256 may be deemed necessary or desirable by the Manager to secure payment of the project obligations and 257 to provide for the remedies of the Manager or other holder of the project obligations in the event of any 258 default or nonpayment by the eligible borrower or other project sponsor or sponsors, including, without 259 *limitation, any of the following:*

260 a. The procurement of credit enhancements or liquidity arrangements for project obligations from 261 any source, public or private, and the payment therefor of premiums, fees, or other charges.

262 b. The combination of one or more projects, or the combination of one or more projects with one or 263 more other undertakings, facilities, or systems, for the purpose of operations and financing, and the 264 pledging of the revenues from such combined projects, undertakings, facilities, and systems to secure 265 project obligations issued in connection with such combination or any part or parts thereof.

266 c. The payment of such fees and charges in connection with the acquisition of the project obligations 267 as may be determined by the Manager.

268 C. All eligible borrowers and other project sponsors, including any localities, providing project 269 obligations to the Bank are authorized to perform any acts, take any action, adopt any proceedings, and 270 make and carry out any contracts with the Bank, the Manager, or the Commonwealth Transportation 271 Board that are contemplated by this article. Such contracts need not be identical among all eligible borrowers or other project sponsors, but may be structured as determined by the Manager according to 272 273 the needs of the contracting eligible borrowers and other project sponsors and the purposes of the 274 Bank.

275 In addition, subject to the approval of the Manager, any project sponsor is authorized to establish 276 and contract with a special purpose or limited instrumentality, corporation, or other entity for the 277 purpose of having such entity serve as the eligible borrower with respect to a particular project. 278

§ 33.1-23.12. Exemption from taxation; exemption from Virginia Public Procurement Act.

279 A. The Bank will be performing an essential governmental function in the exercise of the powers 280 conferred upon it by this article. Accordingly, the Bank shall not be required to pay any taxes or 281 assessments to the Commonwealth or its localities or any political subdivision thereof upon any capital, 282 moneys or any property or upon any operations of the Bank or the income therefrom, or any taxes or 283 assessments upon any project or any property or project obligation acquired by the Bank under the 284 provisions of this article or upon the income therefrom.

285 B. The provisions of the Virginia Public Procurement Act (§ 2.2-4300 et seq.) shall not apply to the 286 Bank in the exercise of any power conferred under this article. 287

§ 33.1-23.13. Reporting requirement.

288 A. No loan or other financial assistance shall be awarded from the Bank until the Secretary of 289 Transportation has provided copies of the management agreement and related criteria and guidelines to 290 the Chairmen of the House Committees on Appropriations, Finance, and Transportation and the Senate 291 Committees on Finance and Transportation.

292 B. Within 30 days after each six-month period ending June 30 and December 31, the Secretary of 293 Finance shall provide a report to the Chairmen of the House Committees on Appropriations, Finance, 294 and Transportation and the Senate Committees on Finance and Transportation, which shall include, but 295 not be limited to, the amounts of loans and other financial assistance provided by the Bank and the 296 projects for which the loans and other financial assistance were provided. 297

Article 1.3.

Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Transportation Grant Anticipation Revenue Notes.

299 § 33.1-23.14. Short title; definitions.

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300 A. This article shall be known and may be cited as the "Commonwealth of Virginia Federal 301 Transportation Grant Anticipation Revenue Notes Act of 2011."

- 302 B. As used in this article, unless the context requires a different meaning:
- 303 "Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes" or "FRANs" means 304 the obligations issued by the Board pursuant to the FRANs Act.
- 305 "Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes Act" or "FRANs

306 Act" means subdivision 4d of § 33.1-269 and the second enactment of Chapters 1019 and 1044 of the Acts of Assembly of 2000, as amended by Chapter 655 of the Acts of Assembly of 2005. 307

308 "Federal highway reimbursements" means all federal-aid highway construction reimbursements and 309 any other federal highway assistance received from time to time by the Commonwealth under or in 310 accordance with Title 23 of the United States Code or any successor program established under federal 311 law from the Federal Highway Administration and any successor or additional federal agencies.

GARVEE" means an "eligible debt financing instrument" as defined under § 122 of Chapter 1 of 312 313 Title 23 of the United States Code, the principal of and interest on which and certain other costs associated therewith may be reimbursed by federal highway reimbursements. 314

315 "Notes" means those notes authorized and issued pursuant to § 33.1-23.15.

"Project-specific reimbursements" means the federal highway reimbursements received by the 316 Commonwealth from time to time only with respect to the project or projects to be financed by the 317 318 Notes or any series thereof.

319 "Series" means any grouping of Notes issued at one time or from time to time as designated as such 320 by the Board as necessary or desirable for administrative convenience, satisfaction of federal tax or 321 securities law requirements, or any similar purpose.

322 § 33.1-23.15. Authorization of Notes.

323 The Board is hereby authorized, by and with the consent of the Governor, to issue, pursuant to the 324 provisions of the State Revenue Bond Act (§ 33.1-267 et seq.), in one or more series from time to time 325 revenue obligations of the Commonwealth to be designated "Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Transportation Grant Anticipation Revenue Notes, Series .," provided that the aggregate principal amount outstanding at any time shall not exceed \$1.2 billion (exclusive of any obligations that may be 326 327 328 issued to refund such notes in accordance with § 33.1-293) plus an amount for financing expenses (including, without limitation, any original issue discount). Notwithstanding the foregoing, at no time 329 330 shall the sum of the outstanding aggregate principal amount of the Notes plus the outstanding aggregate 331 principal amount of the FRANs exceed \$1.2 billion (exclusive of any obligations that may be issued to 332 refund such Notes or FRANs in accordance with § 33.1-293), plus an amount for financing expenses 333 (including, without limitation, any original issue discount). 334

§ 33.1-23.16. Use of proceeds of Notes.

335 A. The net proceeds of the Notes shall be used exclusively for the purpose of providing funds, 336 together with any other available funds, for paying the costs incurred or to be incurred for construction 337 or funding of such projects to be designated by the Board.

B. The proceeds of Notes, including any premium received on the sale thereof, shall be made available by the Board to pay costs of the projects and, where appropriate, may be paid to any 338 339 authority, locality, commission, or other entity for the purposes of paying for costs of the projects. The proceeds of Notes may be used together with any federal, local, or private funds that may be made 340 341 342 available for such purpose. The proceeds of Notes, together with any investment earnings thereon, may 343 at the discretion of the Board secure the payment of principal or purchase price of and redemption 344 premium, if any, and interest on Notes. 345

§ 33.1-23.17. Details of Notes.

A. The terms and structure of each issue of Notes shall be determined by the Board, subject to 346 347 approval by the Treasury Board if required in accordance with § 2.2-2416. The Notes of each issue 348 shall be dated, shall be issued in a principal amount (subject to the limitation as to amount outstanding 349 at any one time set forth in § 33.1-23.15), shall bear interest at such rate or rates that may be fixed, 350 adjustable, variable, or a combination thereof, and may be determined by a formula or other method, 351 shall mature at such time or times not exceeding 20 years after the issuance thereof, and may be made 352 subject to purchase or redemption before their maturity or maturities, at such price or prices and under 353 such terms and conditions, all as may be determined by the Board. The Board shall determine the form 354 and series designations of Notes, whether Notes are certificated or uncertificated, and fix the authorized 355 denomination or denominations of Notes and the place or places of payment of principal or purchase price of and redemption premium, if any, and interest on Notes, which may be at the office of the State 356 357 Treasurer or any bank or trust company within or without the Commonwealth. The principal or 358 purchase price of and redemption premium, if any, and interest on Notes shall be made payable in 359 lawful money of the United States of America. Each issue of Notes may be issued under a system of 360 book entry for recording the ownership and transfer of ownership of rights to receive payments of principal or purchase price of and redemption premium, if any, and interest on such Notes. All Notes 361 362 shall have and are hereby declared to have, as between successive holders, all the qualities and 363 incidents of negotiable instruments under the negotiable instruments law of the Commonwealth.

364 B. The Board may sell Notes from time to time at public or private sale, by competitive bidding, 365 negotiated sale, or private placement, for such price or prices as it may determine to be in the best 366 interests of the Commonwealth.

367 *§ 33.1-23.18.* Form and manner of execution; signature of person ceasing to be officer.

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368 The Notes shall be signed on behalf of the Board by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Board, 369 or shall bear the facsimile signature of such officer, and shall bear the official seal of the Board, which 370 shall be attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the secretary or assistant secretary of the Board. In the event that Notes shall bear the facsimile signature of the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of 371 372 the Board, such Notes shall be signed by such administrative assistant as the Chairman of the Board 373 shall determine or by any registrar/paying agent that may be designated by the Board. In case any 374 officer whose signature or a facsimile of whose signature appears on any Notes shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of such Notes, such signature or facsimile signature nevertheless shall be 375 376 valid and sufficient for all purposes as if such officer had remained in office until such delivery. 377 § 33.1-23.19. Authority to obtain GARVEE approval.

378 The Board is authorized to seek any necessary approvals for the issuance of Notes as GARVEEs **379** from the Federal Highway Administration and any successor or additional federal agencies.

380 § 33.1-23.20. Expenses.

All expenses incurred under this article or in connection with issuance of Notes shall be paid from
 the proceeds of such Notes or from any available funds as the Board shall determine.

383 § 33.1-23.21. Deposit of proceeds.

The proceeds of each series of Notes shall be placed by the State Treasurer in a special fund in the
state treasury or may be placed with a trustee in accordance with § 33.1-283 and shall be disbursed
only for the purpose for which such series shall be issued.

387 § *33.1-23.22. Other funds.*

The Board is hereby authorized to receive any other funds that may be made available to pay costs of the projects and, subject to appropriation by the General Assembly or allocation or designation by the Board, as the case may be, to make available the same to the payment of principal or purchase price of and redemption premium, if any, and interest on Notes authorized hereby and to enter into the appropriate agreements to allow for those funds to be paid into the state treasury, or to a trustee in accordance with § 33.1-283 to pay a part of the costs of the projects or to pay principal or purchase price of and redemption premium, if any, and interest on Notes.

395 § 33.1-23.23. Application of project-specific reimbursements.

396 A. In accordance with Article X, Section 7 of the Constitution of Virginia and § 2.2-1802, all federal 397 highway reimbursements are paid into the state treasury. In connection with each series of Notes issued 398 pursuant to this article, the Board shall establish a fund in accordance with § 33.1-286 either in the 399 state treasury or with a trustee in accordance with § 33.1-283, which secures and is used for the 400 payment of such series of Notes to the credit of which there shall be deposited such amounts, 401 appropriated therefor by the General Assembly, as are required to pay principal or purchase price of, 402 and redemption premium, if any, and interest on Notes, as and when due and payable, (i) first from the 403 project-specific reimbursements; (ii) then, at the discretion of the Board, to the extent required, from 404 legally available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund; and (iii) then from such other funds, if any, 405 which are designated by the General Assembly for such purpose.

406 B. The Board is authorized to provide that the pledge of federal highway reimbursements and any 407 other federal highway assistance received for all or any series of the Notes will be subordinate to any 408 prior pledge thereof to notes issued pursuant to subdivision 4d of § 33.1-269 and the second enactments 409 of Chapters 1019 and 1044 of the Acts of Assembly of 2000, as amended by Chapter 655 of the Acts of 410 Assembly of 2005, and that the obligation to make transfers of federal highway reimbursements and any 411 other federal highway assistance received or other amounts into any fund established under subsection 412 A will be subordinate to the obligation to make any required payments or deposits on or with respect to 413 notes issued pursuant to subdivision 4d of § 33.1-269 and the second enactments of Chapters 1019 and 414 1044 of the Acts of Assembly of 2000, as amended by Chapter 655 of the Acts of Assembly of 2005.

415 § 33.1-23.24. Investment of proceeds and other amounts.

416 Notes proceeds and moneys in any reserve funds and sinking funds in respect of Notes shall be
417 invested by the State Treasurer in accordance with the provisions of general law relating to the
418 investment of such funds belonging to or in the control of the Commonwealth, or by a trustee in
419 accordance with § 33.1-283.

420 § 33.1-23.25. *Exemption from taxation.*

The interest income from and any profit made on the sale of the Notes issued under the provisions of
this article shall at all times be free and exempt from taxation by the Commonwealth and by any
municipality, county, or other political subdivision thereof.

424 § 33.1-23.26. Notes as eligible securities.

425 All Notes issued under the provisions of this article are hereby made securities in which all persons 426 and entities listed in § 33.1-280 may properly and legally invest funds under their control.

427 § 33.1-221.1:1.3. Intercity Passenger Rail Operating and Capital Fund.

428 A. The General Assembly declares it to be in the public interest that developing and continuing

429 intercity passenger rail operations and the development of rail infrastructure, rolling stock, and support 430 facilities to support intercity passenger rail service are important elements of a balanced transportation 431 system in the Commonwealth and further declares it to be in the public interest that the retention, 432 maintenance, improvement, and development of intercity passenger rail-related infrastructure 433 improvements and operations are essential to the Commonwealth's continued economic growth, vitality, 434 and competitiveness in national and world markets.

435 B. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the 436 Intercity Passenger Rail Operating and Capital Fund, which shall be considered a special fund within 437 the Transportation Trust Fund. The Intercity Passenger Rail Operating and Capital Fund shall be 438 established on the books of the Comptroller and shall consist of funds as may be set forth in the appropriation act and by allocation of funds for operations and projects pursuant to this section by the 439 440 Commonwealth Transportation Board in accordance with § 33.1-23.1. Interest earned on moneys in the Intercity Passenger Rail Operating and Capital Fund shall remain in the Intercity Passenger Rail 441 442 Operating and Capital Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys remaining in the Intercity Passenger 443 Rail Operating and Capital Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not 444 revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Intercity Passenger Rail Operating and Capital Fund. 445 Moneys in the Intercity Passenger Rail Operating and Capital Fund shall be used solely as provided in this section. Expenditures and disbursements from the Intercity Passenger Rail Operating and Capital 446 447 Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request 448 signed by the Director of the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation or his designee.

449 C. The Director of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation shall administer and expend or commit, subject to the approval of the Commonwealth Transportation Board, the Intercity Passenger Rail Operating and Capital Fund to support the cost of operating intercity passenger rail service; acquiring, leasing, and/or improving railways or railroad equipment, rolling stock, rights-of-way, or 450 451 452 453 facilities; or assisting other appropriate entities to acquire, lease, or improve railways or railroad 454 equipment, rolling stock, rights-of-way, or facilities for intercity passenger rail transportation purposes 455 whenever the Board shall have determined that such acquisition, lease, and/or improvement is for the 456 common good of a region of the Commonwealth or the Commonwealth as a whole. Funds provided in 457 this section may also be used as matching funds for federal grants to support intercity passenger rail 458 projects.

459 D. Capital projects including tracks and facilities constructed and property, equipment, and rolling 460 stock purchased with funds under this section shall be the property of the Commonwealth for the useful 461 life of the project, as determined by the Director of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation, 462 and shall be made available for use by all intercity passenger rail operations and common carriers using the railway system to which they connect under the trackage rights or operating agreements 463 464 between the parties. Projects undertaken pursuant to this section shall be limited to those of a region of 465 the Commonwealth or the Commonwealth as a whole. Such projects undertaken pursuant to this section 466 shall not require a matching contribution; however, projects proposed with matching funds may receive 467 more favorable consideration. Matching funds may be provided from any source except Commonwealth 468 Transportation Fund revenues. 469

§ 33.1-268. Definitions.

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As used in this article, the following words and terms shall have the following meanings:

471 (1) The word "Board" means the Commonwealth Transportation Board, or if the Commonwealth 472 Transportation Board is abolished, any board, commission or officer succeeding to the principal 473 functions thereof or upon whom the powers given by this article to the Board shall be given by law. 474

(2) The word "project" or "projects" means any one or more of the following:

475 (a) York River Bridges, extending from a point within the Town of Yorktown in York County, or within York County across the York River to Gloucester Point or some point in Gloucester County. 476

477 (b) Rappahannock River Bridge, extending from Greys Point, or its vicinity, in Middlesex County, 478 across the Rappahannock River to a point in the vicinity of White Stone, in Lancaster County, or at 479 some other feasible point in the general vicinity of the two respective points. 480

(c), (d) [Reserved.]

481 (e) James River Bridge, from a point at or near Jamestown, in James City County, across the James River to a point in Surry County. 482 483

(f), (g) [Reserved.]

(h) James River, Chuckatuck and Nansemond River Bridges, together with necessary connecting 484 485 roads, in the Cities of Newport News and Suffolk and the County of Isle of Wight. 486

(i) [Reserved.]

487 (i) Hampton Roads Bridge, Tunnel, or Bridge and Tunnel System, extending from a point or points 488 in the Cities of Newport News and Hampton on the northwest shore of Hampton Roads across Hampton 489 Roads to a point or points in the City of Norfolk or Suffolk on the southeast shore of Hampton Roads.

490 (k) The Norfolk-Virginia Beach Highway, extending from a point in the vicinity of the intersection

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491 of Interstate Route 64 and Primary Route 58 at Norfolk to some feasible point between London Bridge 492 and Primary Route 60.

493 (1) The Henrico-James River Bridge, extending from a point on the eastern shore of the James River 494 in Henrico County to a point on the western shore, between Falling Creek and Bells Road interchanges 495 of the Richmond-Petersburg Turnpike; however, the project shall be deemed to include all property, 496 rights, easements and franchises relating to any of the foregoing projects and deemed necessary or 497 convenient for the operation thereof and to include approaches thereto.

498 (m) The limited access highway between the Patrick Henry Airport area and the Newport News 499 downtown area which generally runs parallel to tracks of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railroad.

500 (n) Transportation improvements in the Dulles Corridor, with an eastern terminus of the East Falls 501 Church Metrorail station at Interstate Route 66 and a western terminus of Virginia Route 772 in 502 Loudoun County, including without limitation the Dulles Toll Road, the Dulles Access Road, outer 503 roadways adjacent or parallel thereto, mass transit, including rail, bus rapid transit, and capacity enhancing treatments such as High-Occupancy Vehicle lanes, High-Occupancy Toll (HOT) lanes, 504 interchange improvements, commuter parking lots, and other transportation management strategies. 505 506

(o), (p) [Repealed.]

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507 (q) Subject to the limitations and approvals of § 33.1-279.1, any other highway for a primary 508 highway transportation improvement district or transportation service district which the Board has agreed 509 to finance under a contract with any such district or any other alternative mechanism for generation of 510 local revenues for specific funding of a project satisfactory to the Commonwealth Transportation Board, 511 the financing for which is to be secured by Transportation Trust Fund revenues under any appropriation 512 made by the General Assembly for that purpose and payable first from revenues received under such 513 contract or other local funding source, second, to the extent required, from funds appropriated and 514 allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as provided by law, to the highway construction 515 district in which the project is located or to the county or counties in which the project is located and 516 third, to the extent required from other legally available revenues of the Trust Fund and from any other 517 available source of funds. 518

(r) U.S. 58 Corridor Development Program projects as defined in §§ 33.1-221.1:2 and 58.1-815.

(s) The Northern Virginia Transportation District Program as defined in § 33.1-221.1:3.

520 (t) Any program for highways or mass transit or transportation facilities, endorsed by the local 521 jurisdiction or jurisdictions affected, which agree that certain distributions of state recordation taxes will 522 be dedicated and used for the payment of any bonds or other obligations, including interest thereon, the 523 proceeds of which were used to pay the cost of the program. Any such program shall be referred to as a 524 "Transportation Improvement Program."

525 (u) Any project designated from time to time by the General Assembly financed in whole or part 526 through the issuance of Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes. 527 (v) Any project authorized by the General Assembly financed in whole or in part by funds from the

528 Priority Transportation Fund established pursuant to § 33.1-23.03:8 or from the proceeds of bonds whose 529 debt service is paid in whole or in part by funds from such Fund.

530 (w) Any project identified by the Commonwealth Transportation Board to be financed in whole or in 531 part through the issuance of Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Transportation Grant Anticipation 532 Revenue Notes.

533 (3) The word "undertaking" means all of the projects authorized to be acquired or constructed under 534 this article.

535 (4) The word "improvements" means such repairs, replacements, additions and betterments of and to 536 a project acquired by purchase or by condemnation as are deemed necessary to place it in a safe and 537 efficient condition for the use of the public, if such repairs, replacements, additions and betterments are 538 ordered prior to the sale of any bonds for the acquisition of such project.

539 (5) The term "cost of project" as applied to a project to be acquired by purchase or by 540 condemnation, includes the purchase price or the amount of the award, cost of improvements, financing 541 charges, interest during any period of disuse before completion of improvements, cost of traffic 542 estimates and of engineering and legal expenses, plans, specifications and surveys, estimates of cost and 543 of revenues, other expenses necessary or incident to determining the feasibility or practicability of the 544 enterprises, administrative expenses and such other expenses as may be necessary or incident to the 545 financing herein authorized and the acquisition of the project and the placing of the project in operation.

546 (6) The term "cost of project" as applied to a project to be constructed, embraces the cost of 547 construction, the cost of all lands, properties, rights, easements and franchises acquired which are 548 deemed necessary for such construction, the cost of acquiring by purchase or condemnation any ferry 549 which is deemed by the Board to be competitive with any bridge to be constructed, the cost of all machinery and equipment, financing charges, interest prior to and during construction and for one year 550 551 after completion of construction, cost of traffic estimates and of engineering data, engineering and legal

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552 expenses, cost of plans, specifications and surveys, estimates of cost and of revenues, other expenses 553 necessary or incident to determining the feasibility or practicability of the enterprise, administrative expense and such other expenses as may be necessary or incident to the financing herein authorized, the 554 555 construction of the project, the placing of the project in operation and the condemnation of property 556 necessary for such construction and operation.

(7) The word "owner" includes all individuals, incorporated companies, copartnerships, societies or 557 558 associations having any title or interest in any property rights, easements or franchises authorized to be 559 acquired by this article. 560

(8) [Repealed.]

(9) The words "revenue" and "revenues" include tolls and any other moneys received or pledged by 561 562 the Board pursuant to this article, including, without limitation, legally available Transportation Trust 563 Fund revenues and any federal highway reimbursements and any other federal highway assistance 564 received from time to time by the Commonwealth.

(10) The terms "toll project" and "toll projects" mean projects financed in whole or in part through 565 the issuance of revenue bonds which are secured by toll revenues generated by such project or projects. 566 567

§ 33.1-269. General powers of Board.

The Commonwealth Transportation Board may, subject to the provisions of this article:

569 1. Acquire by purchase or by condemnation, construct, improve, operate and maintain any one or 570 more of the projects mentioned and included in the undertaking defined in this article;

571 2. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth, to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of Virginia Toll Revenue Bonds," payable from earnings and from any other available sources of funds, to 572 573 pay the cost of such projects;

574 3. Subject to the limitations and approvals of § 33.1-279.1, issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Contract 575 576 Revenue Bonds," secured by Transportation Trust Fund revenues under a payment agreement between 577 the Board and the Treasury Board, subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly and payable 578 first from revenues received pursuant to contracts with a primary highway transportation improvement 579 district or transportation service district or other local revenue sources for which specific funding of any 580 such bonds may be authorized by law; second, to the extent required, from funds appropriated and 581 allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as provided by law, to the highway construction 582 district in which the project or projects to be financed are located or to the county or counties in which 583 the project or projects to be financed are located; and third, to the extent required, from other legally 584 available revenues of the Trust Fund and from any other available source of funds;

585 4. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds," secured (i) by revenues received from the U.S. Route 58 586 587 Corridor Development Fund, subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly, (ii) to the extent 588 required, from revenues legally available from the Transportation Trust Fund and (iii) to the extent 589 required, from any other legally available funds which have been appropriated by the General Assembly;

590 4a. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of 591 Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds," secured, subject to their appropriation by the General 592 Assembly, first from (i) revenues received from the Northern Virginia Transportation District Fund, (ii) 593 to the extent required, funds appropriated and allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as 594 provided by law, to the highway construction district in which the project or projects to be financed are 595 located or to the city or county in which the project or projects to be financed are located, (iii) to the extent required, legally available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, and (iv) such other funds 596 597 which may be appropriated by the General Assembly;

598 4b. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Program Revenue Bonds" secured, subject to their appropriation by the General 599 600 Assembly, first from (i) any revenues received from any Set-aside Fund established by the General 601 Assembly pursuant to § 58.1-816.1, (ii) to the extent required, revenues received pursuant to any 602 contract with a local jurisdiction or any alternative mechanism for generation of local revenues for 603 specific funding of a project satisfactory to the Commonwealth Transportation Board, (iii) to the extent **604** required, funds appropriated and allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as provided by 605 law, to the highway construction district in which the project or projects to be financed are located or to 606 the city or county in which the project or projects to be financed are located, (iv) to the extent required, legally available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, and (v) such other funds which may be 607 608 appropriated by the General Assembly. No bonds for any project or projects shall be issued under the 609 authority of this subsection unless such project or projects are specifically included in a bill or resolution 610 passed by the General Assembly;

4c. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of 611 612 Virginia Transportation Program Revenue Bonds" secured, subject to their appropriation by the General 613 Assembly, first from (i) any revenues received from the Commonwealth Transit Capital Fund established

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by the General Assembly pursuant to subdivision A 4 g of § 58.1-638, (ii) to the extent required, legally
available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, and (iii) such other funds which may be
appropriated by the General Assembly. No bonds for any project or projects shall be issued under the
authority of this subsection unless such project or projects are specifically included in a bill or resolution
passed by the General Assembly;

4d. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth from time to time to be known and designated as
"Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes" secured, subject to
their appropriation by the General Assembly, (i) first from any federal highway reimbursements and any
other federal highway assistance received from time to time by the Commonwealth, (ii) then, at the
discretion of the Board, to the extent required, from legally available revenues of the Transportation
Trust Fund, and (iii) then from such other funds, if any, which are designated by the General Assembly
for such purpose;

4e. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth from time to time to be known and designated as
"Commonwealth of Virginia Credit Assistance Revenue Bonds," secured, subject to their appropriation
by the General Assembly, solely from revenues with respect to or generated by the project or projects
being financed thereby and any tolls or other revenues pledged by the Board as security therefor and in
accordance with the applicable federal credit assistance authorized with respect to such project or
projects by the United States Department of Transportation;

4f. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of
Virginia Transportation Capital Projects Revenue Bonds," secured, subject to their appropriation by the
General Assembly, (i) from the revenues deposited into the Priority Transportation Fund established
pursuant to § 33.1-23.03:8; (ii) to the extent required, from revenues legally available from the
Transportation Trust Fund; and (iii) to the extent required, from any other legally available funds;

4g. Issue grant anticipation notes of the Commonwealth from time to time to be known and
designated as "Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Transportation Grant Anticipation Revenue Notes"
secured, subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly, (i) first from the project-specific
reimbursements; (ii) then, at the discretion of the Board, to the extent required, from legally available
revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund; and (iii) then from such other funds, if any, which are
designated by the General Assembly for such purpose;

5. Fix and collect tolls and other charges for the use of such projects or to refinance the cost of such projects;

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6. Construct grade separations at intersections of any projects with public highways, streets or other
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647 public ways or places and change and adjust the lines and grades thereof so as to accommodate the
648 same to the design of such grade separations, the cost of such grade separations and any damage
648 incurred in changing and adjusting the lines and grades of such highways, streets, ways and places to be
649 ascertained and paid by the Board as a part of the cost of the project;

650 7. Vacate or change the location of any portion of any public highway, street or other public way or 651 place and reconstruct the same at such new location as the Board deems most favorable for the project 652 and of substantially the same type and in as good condition as the original highway, streets, way or 653 place, the cost of such reconstruction and any damage incurred in vacating or changing the location 654 thereof to be ascertained and paid by the Board as a part of the cost of the project. Any public highway, 655 street or other public way or place vacated or relocated by the Board shall be vacated or relocated in the 656 manner provided by law for the vacation or relocation of public roads and any damages awarded on account thereof may be paid by the Board as a part of the cost of the project; 657

658 8. Make reasonable regulations for the installation, construction, maintenance, repair, renewal and 659 relocation of pipes, mains, sewers, conduits, cables, wires, towers, poles and other equipment and appliances herein called "public utility facilities," of the Commonwealth and of any municipality, county, 660 or other political subdivision, public utility or public service corporation owning or operating the same **661** in, on, along, over or under the project. Whenever the Board determines that it is necessary that any 662 such public utility facilities should be relocated or removed, the Commonwealth or such municipality, 663 664 county, political subdivision, public utility or public service corporation shall relocate or remove the 665 same in accordance with the order of the Board. The cost and expense of such relocation or removal, 666 including the cost of installing such public utility facilities in a new location or locations, and the cost 667 of any lands or any rights or interests in lands, and any other rights acquired to accomplish such 668 relocation or removal shall be ascertained by the Board.

669 On any toll project, the Board shall pay the cost and expense of relocation or removal as a part of 670 the cost of the project for those public utility facilities owned or operated by the Commonwealth or such 671 municipality, county, political subdivision, public utility or public service corporation. On all other 672 projects, under this article, the Board shall pay the cost and expense of relocation or removal as a part 673 of the cost of the project for those public utility facilities owned or operated by the Commonwealth or 674 such municipality, county, or political subdivision. The Commonwealth or such municipality, county,

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675 political subdivision, public utility or public service corporation may maintain and operate such public 676 utility facilities with the necessary appurtenances, in the new location or locations, for as long a period and upon the same terms and conditions as it had the right to maintain and operate such public utility 677 678 facilities in their former location or locations;

679 9. Acquire by the exercise of the power of eminent domain any lands, property, rights, rights-of-way, 680 franchises, easements and other property, including public lands, parks, playgrounds, reservations, 681 highways or parkways, or parts thereof or rights therein, of any municipality, county or other political **682** subdivision, deemed necessary or convenient for the construction or the efficient operation of the project 683 or necessary in the restoration, replacement or relocation of public or private property damaged or **684** destroyed.

The cost of such projects shall be paid solely from the proceeds of Commonwealth of Virginia Toll 685 or Transportation Contract Revenue Bonds or a combination thereof or from such proceeds and from 686 **687** any grant or contribution which may be made thereto pursuant to the provisions of this article;

10. Notwithstanding any provision of this article to the contrary, the Board shall be authorized to 688 689 exercise the powers conferred herein, in addition to its general powers to acquire rights-of-way and to construct, operate and maintain state highways, with respect to any project which the General Assembly 690 691 has authorized or may hereafter authorize to be financed in whole or in part through the issuance of bonds of the Commonwealth pursuant to the provisions of Section 9 (c) of Article X of the Constitution **692** 693 of Virginia; and

694 11. Enter into any agreements or take such other actions as the Board shall determine in connection 695 with applying for or obtaining any federal credit assistance, including without limitation loan guarantees 696 and lines of credit, pursuant to authorization from the United States Department of Transportation with 697 respect to any project included in the Commonwealth's long-range transportation plan and the approved State Transportation Improvement Program. **698** 699

§ 33.1-276. Revenue bonds.

700 The Board may provide by resolution, at one time or from time to time, for the issuance of revenue 701 bonds, notes, or other revenue obligations of the Commonwealth for the purpose of paying all or any 702 part of the cost as hereinabove defined of any one or more projects as hereinabove defined. The 703 principal or purchase price of, and redemption premium, if any, and interest on such obligations shall be 704 payable solely from the special funds herein provided for such payment. "Special funds" for the 705 purposes of this section shall include any such funds established for Commonwealth of Virginia Toll 706 Revenue Bonds, Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Contract Revenue Bonds, Commonwealth of 707 Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds, or Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes, or Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Transportation Grant Anticipation Revenue 708 709 Notes. 710

§ 33.1-277. Credit of Commonwealth not pledged.

711 A. Commonwealth of Virginia Toll Revenue Bonds issued under the provisions of this article shall 712 not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the faith and credit 713 of the Commonwealth, but such bonds shall be payable solely from the funds herein provided therefor 714 from tolls and revenues, from bond proceeds or earnings thereon and from any other available sources 715 of funds. All such bonds shall state on their face that the Commonwealth of Virginia is not obligated to 716 pay the same or the interest thereon except from the special fund provided therefor from tolls and 717 revenues under this article, from bond proceeds or earnings thereon and from any other available sources of funds and that the faith and credit of the Commonwealth are not pledged to the payment of the 718 719 principal or interest of such bonds. The issuance of such revenue bonds under the provisions of this 720 article shall not directly or indirectly or contingently obligate the Commonwealth to levy or to pledge any form of taxation whatever therefor or to make any appropriation for their payment, other than 721 722 appropriate available funds derived as revenues from tolls and charges under this article or derived from 723 bond proceeds or earnings thereon and from any other available sources of funds.

724 B. Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Contract Revenue Bonds issued under the provisions of 725 this article shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the 726 faith and credit of the Commonwealth, but such bonds shall be payable solely from the funds herein 727 provided therefor (i) from revenues received pursuant to contracts with a primary highway transportation 728 district or transportation service district or any other alternative mechanism for generation of local 729 revenues for specific funding of a project satisfactory to the Commonwealth Transportation Board, (ii) to 730 the extent required, from funds appropriated and allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as 731 provided by law, to the highway construction district in which the project or projects to be financed are 732 located or to the county or counties in which such project or projects are located, (iii) from bond proceeds or earnings thereon, (iv) to the extent required, from other legally available revenues of the 733 Trust Fund, and (v) from any other available source of funds. All such bonds shall state on their face 734 735 that the Commonwealth of Virginia is not obligated to pay the same or the interest thereon except from revenues in clauses (i) and (iii) hereof and that the faith and credit of the Commonwealth are not 736

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737 pledged to the payment of the principal and interest of such bonds. The issuance of such revenue bonds 738 under the provisions of this article shall not directly or indirectly or contingently obligate the 739 Commonwealth to levy or to pledge any form of taxation whatever or to make any appropriation for 740 their payment, other than to appropriate available funds derived as revenues under this article from the 741 sources set forth in clauses (i) and (iii) hereof. Nothing in this article shall be construed to obligate the 742 General Assembly to make any appropriation of the funds set forth in clause (ii) or (iv) hereof for 743 payment of such bonds.

744 C. Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds issued under the provisions of this 745 article shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the full 746 faith and credit of the Commonwealth, but such bonds shall be payable solely from the funds herein 747 provided therefor (i) from revenues received from the U.S. Route 58 Corridor Development Fund, 748 subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly, (ii) to the extent required, from revenues legally 749 available from the Transportation Trust Fund and (iii) to the extent required, from any other legally 750 available funds which shall have been appropriated by the General Assembly.

751 D. Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds issued under this article for Category 1 752 projects as provided in subdivision (2) (s) of § 33.1-268 shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the 753 Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the faith and credit of the Commonwealth. Such bonds shall 754 be payable solely, subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly, first from (i) revenues 755 received from the Northern Virginia Transportation District Fund, (ii) to the extent required, funds appropriated and allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as provided by law, to the 756 757 highway construction district in which the project or projects to be financed are located or to the city or 758 county in which the project or projects to be financed are located, (iii) to the extent required, legally available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, and (iv) such other funds which may be 759 760 appropriated by the General Assembly.

E. Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Program Revenue Bonds issued under this article for 761 762 projects defined in subdivision (2) (t) of § 33.1-268 shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the 763 Commonwealth or a pledge of the faith and credit of the Commonwealth. Such bonds shall be payable 764 solely, subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly, first from (i) any revenues received from any Set-aside Fund established by the General Assembly pursuant to § 58.1-816.1, (ii) to the extent 765 766 required, revenues received pursuant to any contract with a local jurisdiction or any alternative mechanism for generation of local revenues for specific funding of a project satisfactory to the 767 Commonwealth Transportation Board, (iii) to the extent required, funds appropriated and allocated, 768 769 pursuant to the highway allocation formula as provided by law, to the highway construction district in 770 which the project or projects to be financed are located or to the city or county in which the project or 771 projects to be financed are located, (iv) to the extent required, legally available revenues from the 772 Transportation Trust Fund, and (v) such other funds which may be appropriated by the General 773 Assembly.

774 F. Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes issued under this 775 article shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth, but such obligations shall be payable solely, subject to 776 777 appropriation by the General Assembly, (i) first from any federal highway reimbursements and any other 778 federal highway assistance received from time to time by the Commonwealth, (ii) then, at the discretion 779 of the Board, to the extent required, from legally available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, 780 and (iii) then, from such other funds, if any, which are designated by the General Assembly for such 781 purpose.

782 G. Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Credit Assistance Revenue Bonds issued under the
783 provisions of this article shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a
784 pledge of the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth, but such obligations shall be payable solely,
785 subject to appropriation by the General Assembly, from revenues with respect to or generated by the
786 project or projects being financed thereby and any tolls or other revenues pledged by the Board as
787 security therefor and in accordance with the applicable federal credit assistance authorized with respect
788 to such project or projects by the United States Department of Transportation.

H. Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Capital Projects Revenue Bonds issued under the provisions of this article for projects as provided in subdivision $2 \neq (2)$ (v) of § 33.1-268 shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth, but such bonds shall be payable solely, subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly, (i) from the revenues deposited into the Priority Transportation Fund established pursuant to § 33.1-23.03:8; (ii) to the extent required, from revenues legally available from the Transportation Trust Fund; and (iii) to the extent required, from any other legally available funds.

796 I. Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Transportation Grant Anticipation Revenue Notes issued under **797** the provisions of Article 1.3 (§ 33.1-23.14 et seq.) of Chapter 1 and this article shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the full faith and credit of the
Commonwealth, but such notes shall be payable solely, subject to their appropriation by the General
Assembly, (i) first from the project-specific reimbursements, (ii) then, at the discretion of the Board, to
the extent required, from legally available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, and (iii) then
from such other funds, if any which are designated by the General Assembly for such purpose

802 from such other funds, if any, which are designated by the General Assembly for such purpose.

803 § 33.1-280. Sale of bonds; bonds as legal investments.

The Board may sell such bonds in such manner and for such price as it may determine to be for the best interests of the Commonwealth, but no such sale shall be made at a price so low as to require the payment of interest on the money received therefor at more than the maximum per centum per annum approved by the Commonwealth Treasury Board with respect to such obligations in accordance with \$ 2.2-2416 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, computed with relation to the absolute maturity of the bonds in accordance with standard tables of bond values, excluding, however, from such computations the amount of any premium to be paid on redemption for any bonds prior to maturity.

811 All bonds heretofore or hereafter issued pursuant to the authority of this article are hereby made 812 securities in which all public officers and bodies of this Commonwealth and all political subdivisions 813 thereof, all insurance companies and associations, all national banks and trust companies, and savings 814 institutions, including savings and loan associations, in the Commonwealth, and all executors, 815 administrators, trustees, and other fiduciaries, both individual or corporate, may properly and legally 816 invest funds within their control.

817 2. That § 2 of the second enactment of Chapter 896 of the Acts of Assembly of 2007 is amended 818 and reenacted as follows:

819 § 2. The Commonwealth Transportation Board is hereby authorized, by and with the consent of the 820 Governor, to issue, pursuant to the provisions of the State Revenue Bond Act (§ 33.1-267 et seq. of the Code of Virginia) as amended from time to time, revenue obligations of the Commonwealth to be 821 822 designated "Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Capital Projects Revenue Bonds, Series" at one or more times in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$3 billion, after all costs; provided 823 824 that the aggregate principal amount issued in any one fiscal year shall not exceed \$300 \$600 million, 825 excluding any refunding bonds. If, the aggregate principal amount issued in any fiscal year is less than 826 300 \$600 million, then the amount by which such issuance is less than 300 \$600 million may be issued in any subsequent fiscal year in addition to the \$300 \$600 million authorized in the subsequent 827 828 fiscal year. The issuance of any bonds under this Act is subject to the provisions of subsection \overline{C} of 829 § 33.1-23.03:8 of the Code of Virginia.

830 3. That the authority to issue additional Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway
831 Reimbursement Anticipation Notes pursuant to the second enactment of Chapters 1019 and 1044
832 of the Acts of Assembly of 2000, as amended by Chapter 655 of the Acts of Assembly of 2005,
833 shall expire on July 1, 2011. Nothing in this enactment shall in any way affect such notes issued
834 prior to July 1, 2011.
