**3. Committee:** Privileges and Elections

**4. Title:** Presidential elections and primaries.

**5. Summary:** Moves the presidential primary date from the second Tuesday in February to the first Tuesday in March and retains the first Tuesday in March as the primary date before the May general election. The bill also reduces the petition requirement for presidential candidates from 10,000 to 5,000 signatures.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Indeterminate cost savings

**8. Fiscal Implications:** Per the State Board of Elections (SBE), this primary schedule should help localities and the SBE conserve considerable financial resources by holding only one primary in 2012, instead of the two the Commonwealth held in 2008. Exact savings cannot be determined at this time.
