**2. Patron:** Athey

**3. Committee:** Courts of Justice

**4. Title:** Eminent domain; changes maximum limit on waiver of appraisals.

**5. Summary:** The proposed legislation would change the maximum limit on waiver of appraisals from \$10,000 to \$25,000, consistent with the amount allowed by federal regulations. The bill also provides that whenever the value of the property being acquired is determined to be between \$10,000 and \$25,000, the owner or his designated representative may request that an appraisal be prepared and used as the basis for establishing just compensation.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** None.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Preliminary. See Item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The provisions of the bill will streamline the acquisition process and aid in meeting proposed construction schedules since a waiver can be prepared in less time than an appraisal. Any savings generated by the provisions of this bill will be applied to other transportation priorities.
