4. Title: Criminal history record information; Department of Rehabilitative Services.

5. Summary: Criminal history record information; Department of Rehabilitative Services. Authorizes the Department of Rehabilitative Services to obtain criminal history record information for the purpose of evaluating an individual's fitness for various types of employment and for the purpose of delivering comprehensive vocational rehabilitation services that will assist the individual in obtaining employment.
