4. Title: License plates; issuance to persons delivering unladen vehicles.

5. Summary: This bill provides that license plates for persons delivering unladen vehicles may also be issued to any business engaged in automobile auctions and can only be used if either the origin or destination of the vehicle being delivered is within the Commonwealth. In addition to the pickup and delivery of a vehicle, use of these license plates shall be limited to driving on the highway in order to test the installation, service, or repairs of vehicle equipment at a distance of not more than five miles from the place of business.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final. See Item #8.

8. Fiscal Implications: The bill addresses certain instances where personnel at auto auctions were stopped and cited for an improper use of the unladen plates since auctions are not included in § 46.2-733. This bill simply codifies current practice regarding the auto auctions. The proposal also permits vehicles with these plates to travel a reasonable mileage from a repair facility for testing a vehicle with unladen plates. A fiscal impact is not anticipated with the bill's passage.
