**4. Title:** International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement examinations

**5. Summary:** Clarifies language (Chapter 598, 2010 Acts of Assembly), that students should be eligible for credit for International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement examinations, not specifically the courses.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill clarifies the language of Chapter 598, 2010 Acts of Assembly, to cover examinations versus courses. There should be no fiscal impact to the colleges and universities, as systems are in place to accept credits for International Baccalaureate or Advanced Placement courses/examinations.
