3. Committee: General Laws

4. Title: Uniform Statewide Building Code (USBC); air conditioning in certain residential buildings.

5. Summary: Designates May 1 as the date when cooling must be supplied in dwelling units, rooming units, or dormitory or guest rooms that are leased and include provision for cooling.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal impact estimates are preliminary. See item 8, below.

8. Fiscal Implications: There may be some costs to the Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) associated with the adoption of the new regulations; however, such costs could be absorbed within existing resources.

Also, state agencies may incur costs in complying with the new regulations. Normally, enforcement of the USBC is the responsibility of the local government's building inspections department. However, the Department of General Services serves as the building official for state projects, except for those at the charter universities. The state impact is indeterminate until such time as an inventory of potentially affected properties is compiled and an assessment is made of any necessary modifications to existing buildings or facilities.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Department of Housing and Community Development, local governments, Department of General Services, other state agencies, and colleges and universities.
