**4. Title:** Pharmacies; continuous quality improvement program

**5. Summary:** This bill requires pharmacies to implement a continuous quality improvement program to provide for a systematic, ongoing process of analysis of dispensing errors that uses findings to formulate an appropriate response and to develop or improve pharmacy systems and workflow processes designed to prevent or reduce future errors.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** It is assumed that the Board of Pharmacy will absorb the negligible costs (estimated at \$3,500 per board) of the rulemaking required to direct pharmacies to implement continuous quality improvement programs. Since the state is not required to implement or oversee these programs, none of the associated costs are reflected in this statement.
