3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: Expands the discounted hunting license for resident and nonresident veterans who have a service-connected disability of at least 70 percent as rated by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

5. Summary: Department of Game and Inland Fisheries currently issues a reduced rate hunting license to veterans who have been designated by the U. S. Dept. of Veteran Affairs to have 100% disability. This bill will reduce the degree of physical impairment to 70%. This reduction will enable an additional 11,300 veterans currently paying full price to receive the discounted rate.

8. Fiscal Implications: The proposed reduction in license fee for this population segment will result in an annual loss of license revenue. The amended language changed the fee discount from a flat fee to a 50% discount, which enabled the per license revenue loss to be lower than what it would have been under the original language of the bill. No budget amendment is necessary to show this decrease.
