3. Committee: Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources

4. Title: Scenic river.

5. Summary: This bill designates a 19.2-mile segment of the Appomattox River, from 100 feet from the base of the Brasfield Dam, excluding the Port Walthall Channel of the River, to the confluence with the James River, in Chesterfield County as a scenic river. Nothing in the bill is to preclude the state or a local government from constructing, reconstructing, operating, or performing necessary maintenance on any road or bridge project. Additionally, the owner of the Harvell Dam in the City of Petersburg may construct, reconstruct, operate, and maintain the Harvell Dam subject to other law and regulation.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary.

8. Fiscal Implications: Studies related to this designation have already been completed by the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR), which is tasked with oversight of these designations. The agency anticipates being able to absorb any additional costs that may result from this bill.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: The Department of Conservation and Recreation.
