**5. Summary:** This bill makes property used to further an abduction of a child subject to lawful seizure and forfeiture.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Final (Indeterminate – see Item #8)

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill allows for the seizure and forfeiture of property from an individual used in connection with the abduction of that individual's child. Upon order of the court, seized property can be forfeited to the Commonwealth when a conviction under § 18.2-47 is obtained. Since the type and value of the property eligible for seizure and forfeiture under this bill can not be predetermined, the fiscal impact is indeterminate.
