8 WHEREAS, W. Raymond Colley, the admired former Deputy Clerk of the United States House of Representatives from 1969 to 1995 who served as vice-chair of the Virginia Democratic Party from 9 1980 to 2000, died on May 3, 2011; and 10

WHEREAS, born in Dickenson County, W. Raymond "Ray" Colley attended high school in Grundy 11 12 before becoming the first member of his family to graduate from college after earning a degree from 13

14 WHEREAS, Ray Colley proudly served his country in the United States Army during the Korean War and afterwards continued to serve in the United States Army Reserves, eventually attaining the rank 15 16

WHEREAS, Ray Colley developed an interest in the workings of government as a young man and 17 18 began his illustrious career covering government and politics for the *Roanoke Times*; and

19 WHEREAS, as Administrative Assistant to Congressman W. Pat Jennings who represented Virginia's 20 "Fighting Ninth" district, Ray Colley gained valuable experience in the legislative process and was proud of the development of legislation and programs to benefit his native area; and 21

22 WHEREAS, Ray Colley also ably served as a legislative liaison during the Johnson administration 23 while an assistant to two Postmasters General before becoming Deputy Clerk of the United States House 24

25 WHEREAS, from 1969 to 1995, Ray Colley faithfully served the members of the United States 26 House of Representatives, managing legislative, financial, contracting, and administrative operations in 27 an efficient and professional manner that enabled the members to pursue their work on behalf of the 28

29 WHEREAS, Ray Colley took an active role in the Democratic Party on the local, state, and national levels, becoming known as the "Father of the Virginia Democratic Party Plan" for his guidance and 30 31 leadership in rewriting the plan and serving as a valued advisor on delegate selection, procedural, and 32 33

WHEREAS, throughout his life, Ray Colley generously supported local community groups, including the Waynewood Elementary School and Fort Hunt High School parent teacher associations and the Waynewood Community Civic Association; and

WHEREAS, a man of great integrity who had a deep and profound love for his country, Ray Colley 36 37 played a vital role in the efficient functioning of the government's legislative branch and leaves behind a 38 legacy of enviable public service; and

39 WHEREAS, a devoted family man, Ray Colley was supported in all his endeavors by his wife of over 60 years, Alice, and his sons, Mark and David and their families; he will be greatly missed by his 40 family, friends, and admirers; now, therefore, be it 41

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby 42 43 note with great sadness the loss of a singularly dedicated and accomplished Virginian, W. Raymond 44
