8	WHEREAS, United States Army Sergeant First Class Wyatt Hampton Belton, who died on March
9 10	31, 1951, while a prisoner of war in North Korea, was brought back to his family in Richmond and laid to rest with full military honors on May 21, 2011; and
10	WHEREAS, as an energetic and adventurous young man, Wyatt "Hampton" Belton desired to serve
12	his country and travel the world; he enlisted in the United States Army and was stationed in Japan when
13	North Korea invaded South Korea on June 25, 1950; and
14	WHEREAS, assigned to the 25th Infantry Division, Sergeant Belton fought to drive North Korean
15	forces out of South Korea; he saw intense action and received a bullet wound to the hand but returned
16 17	to his unit; and WHEREAS, in November 1950, Chinese forces joined with North Korea and launched a major
17	offensive that drove American forces south; during the fighting, Sergeant Belton was taken as a prisoner
19	of war by the North Koreans; and
20	WHEREAS, an extremely strong and courageous soldier, Sergeant Belton passed away four months
21	later; and
22	WHEREAS, listed as missing in action for almost three decades, the United States Army was able to
23 24	confirm Sergeant Belton's death in the 1980s, but it took several more decades of hard work and dedication by skilled diplomats, military personnel, and family members to identify and bring Sergeant
24 25	Belton's earthly remains home for burial; and
26	WHEREAS, Sergeant Belton's family made great sacrifices, enduring distress and uncertainty for
27	over 60 years as they pondered the fate of their beloved son and brother; and
28	WHEREAS, Sergeant Belton's death is a solemn reminder of the perils faced daily by the thousands
29 20	of Americans who serve in our armed forces overseas and whose devotion to duty places them in harm's
30 31	way; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby
32	note with great sadness the death of a courageous and patriotic Virginian, Sergeant First Class Wyatt
33	Hampton Belton; and, be it
34	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution
35	for presentation to the family of Sergeant First Class Wyatt Hampton Belton as an expression of the
36	General Assembly's profound respect for his memory and his and his family's sacrifices.
