Cross, an admired contributor to business and civic life in the City of Fairfax 9 and former member of its City Council, died on July 21, 2011; and 10 WHEREAS, Joan Cross grew up in Iowa, receiving a bachelor's degree from the University of Iowa in public relations and journalism and eventually relocating to Fairfax in the early 1990s; and 11 WHEREAS, in addition to her responsibilities in marketing for the CPA firm of Burdette Smith 12 13 Group P.C., Joan Cross generously gave of her time and creative talents in the community; and WHEREAS, a strong proponent of the importance of small businesses, Joan Cross served on the 14 15 board of directors for the Central Fairfax Chamber of Commerce and helped found Destination Fairfax, a partnership between the City and local businesses to promote tourism; and 16 WHEREAS, Joan Cross influenced the development of the City of Fairfax through her service on the 17 board of architectural review and cochaired the City's Independence Day Celebration Committee, 18 19 ensuring a popular and well-run event for local residents and their families; and 20 WHEREAS, Joan Cross cheerfully supported the local arts community through her service on the 21 boards of the George Mason University Theater of the First Amendment and the City of Fairfax Band 22 Association: and 23 WHEREAS, elected to City Council in 2002, Joan Cross dedicated herself to the efficient and 24 effective running of local government, and ably represented the City on a number of regional boards and 25 commissions; and WHEREAS, the City's longest-serving female council member, Joan Cross served the City of Fairfax 26 27 with great integrity and enthusiasm until her retirement in 2011; and 28 WHEREAS, Joan Cross received numerous awards and accolades for her contributions to the City of 29 Fairfax, including the 2004 Small Business Advocate of the Year award and the Athena Award from the 30 Central Fairfax Chamber of Commerce; and 31 WHEREAS, a gracious and vibrant woman, Joan Cross will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by her husband of 19 years, Ron; her children, Will, John, and Brady and their families; and 32 33 numerous other family members, friends, and admirers; now, therefore, be it 34 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby 35 note with great sadness the loss of an admired public servant and community supporter, Joan W. Cross;
