Celebrating the life of Nancy Harrison Delano Moore.

Unanimous consent to introduce

WHEREAS, Nancy Harrison Delano Moore, a gifted educator and author from Richmond, died on May 23, 2011; and

WHEREAS, a native of Oldhams in Westmoreland County, Nancy Moore graduated from Cople High School and received a bachelor's degree from Westhampton College and a master's degree from Virginia Commonwealth University; and

WHEREAS, an admired teacher who inspired her students and helped them develop an appreciation for literature and skill in writing, Nancy Moore taught in Albemarle County and the Richmond area for several years; and

WHEREAS, Nancy Moore drew upon her education and experience to create an innovative educational program for The Johns Hopkins University's Center for Talented Youth that served third through sixth grade students studying math and writing in Central Virginia and whose curricula served as a model for other programs; and

WHEREAS, Nancy Moore also served as coordinator of Virginia's Governor's Schools and developed the Virginia Governor's School for Medicine at the Medical College of Virginia, which continues to educate students on careers in medicine and the life sciences; and

WHEREAS, an accomplished author, Nancy Moore wrote several books and articles, including Living Every Minute, a chronicle of her mother's life and struggle with dementia, and Kiernan's Jam, which delighted young audiences and won a 2007 Moonbeam Children's Book Awards Bronze Medal;

WHEREAS, Nancy Moore played a vital role in the creation of several Richmond area programs, such as the Women's Resource Center, Commonwealth Parenting Center, and Mother's Morning Out at First Presbyterian Church: and

WHEREAS, a lifelong member of Ebenezer United Methodist Church of Oldhams, Nancy Moore

enjoyed worship, fellowship, and service for many years as chair of the cemetery committee; and WHEREAS, a remarkably talented woman, Nancy Moore will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by her husband of 46 years, Hullihen; children, Sara and Frank and their families; and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Delegates hereby note with great sadness the loss of a beloved educator and author, Nancy Harrison Delano Moore; and, be it
