9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 17.1-507 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 17.1-507. Number of judges; residence requirement; compensation; powers; etc.
12	A. For the several judicial circuits there shall be judges, the number as hereinafter set forth, who
13	shall during their service reside within their respective circuits and whose compensation and powers
14 15	shall be the same as now and hereafter prescribed for circuit judges.

47	B. No additional circuit court judge shall be authorized or provided for any judicial circuit until the
48	Judicial Council has made a study of the need for such additional circuit court judge and has reported
49	its findings and recommendations to the Courts of Justice Committees of the House of Delegates and
50	Senate. The boundary of any judicial circuit shall not be changed until a study has been made by the
51	Judicial Council and a report of its findings and recommendations made to said Committees.

If the Judicial Council finds the need for an additional circuit court judge after a study is made 53 pursuant to subsection B, the study shall be made available to the Compensation Board and the Courts 54 of Justice Committees of the House of Delegates and Senate and Council shall publish notice of such 55 finding in a publication of general circulation among attorneys licensed to practice in the 56 Commonwealth. The Compensation Board shall make a study of the need to provide additional 57 courtroom security and deputy court clerk staffing. This study shall be reported to the Courts of Justice 58 Committees of the House of Delegates and the Senate, and to the Department of Planning and Budget. HB1120
