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## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

An Act to amend and reenact § 2.2-3802 of the Code of Virginia, as it is currently effective and as it 2 3 shall become effective, relating to the Government Data Collection and Dissemination Practices Act; 4 exemptions.

### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. That § 2.2-3802 of the Code of Virginia, as it is currently effective and as it shall become 9 effective, is amended and reenacted as follows:

10 § 2.2-3802. (Effective until July 1, 2012) Systems to which chapter inapplicable.

The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to personal information systems:

- 12 1. Maintained by any court of the Commonwealth;
  - 2. Which may exist in publications of general circulation;

14 3. Contained in the Criminal Justice Information System as defined in §§ 9.1-126 through 9.1-137 or 15 in the Sex Offender and Crimes Against Minors Registry maintained by the Department of State Police pursuant to Chapter 9 (§ 9.1-900 et seq.) of Title 9.1, except to the extent that information is required to 16 be posted on the Internet pursuant to § 9.1-913; 17

18 4. Contained in the Virginia Juvenile Justice Information System as defined in §§ 16.1-222 through 19 16.1-225;

20 5. Maintained by agencies concerning persons required by law to be licensed in the Commonwealth 21 to engage in the practice of any profession, in which case the names and addresses of persons applying for or possessing the license may be disseminated upon written request to a person engaged in the 22 23 profession or business of offering professional educational materials or courses for the sole purpose of 24 providing the licensees or applicants for licenses with informational materials relating solely to available 25 professional educational materials or courses, provided the disseminating agency is reasonably assured 26 that the use of the information will be so limited;

27 6. Maintained by the Parole Board, the Crime Commission, the Judicial Inquiry and Review 28 Commission, the Virginia Racing Commission, and the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control;

29 7. Maintained by the Department of State Police; the police department of the Chesapeake Bay 30 Bridge and Tunnel Commission; police departments of cities, counties, and towns; and the campus 31 police departments of public institutions of higher education as established by Chapter 17 (§ 23-232 et seq.) of Title 23, and that deal with investigations and intelligence gathering relating to criminal activity; 32 33 and maintained by local departments of social services regarding alleged cases of child abuse or neglect 34 while such cases are also subject to an ongoing criminal prosecution; 35

8. Maintained by the Virginia Port Authority as provided in § 62.1-132.4 or 62.1-134.1;

36 9. Maintained by the Virginia Tourism Authority in connection with or as a result of the promotion 37 of travel or tourism in the Commonwealth, in which case names and addresses of persons requesting information on those subjects may be disseminated upon written request to a person engaged in the 38 39 business of providing travel services or distributing travel information, provided the Virginia Tourism 40 Authority is reasonably assured that the use of the information will be so limited;

41 10. Maintained by the Division of Consolidated Laboratory Services of the Department of General 42 Services and the Department of Forensic Science, which deal with scientific investigations relating to 43 criminal activity or suspected criminal activity, except to the extent that § 9.1-1104 may apply;

44 11. Maintained by the Department of Corrections that deal with investigations and intelligence 45 gathering by persons acting under the provisions of § 53.1-16;

12. Maintained by (i) the Department of the State Internal Auditor or internal audit departments of 46 state agencies or institutions that deal with communications and investigations relating to the State 47 48 Employee Fraud, Waste and Abuse Hotline or (ii) an auditor appointed by the local governing body of 49 any county, city, or town or a school board that deals with local investigations required by 50 § 15.2-2511.2; and

13. Maintained by the Department of Social Services or any local department of social services 51 52 relating to public assistance fraud investigations.

53 § 2.2-3802. (Effective July 1, 2012) Systems to which chapter inapplicable.

54 The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to personal information systems:

- 55 1. Maintained by any court of the Commonwealth;
- 2. Which may exist in publications of general circulation; 56

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57 3. Contained in the Criminal Justice Information System as defined in §§ 9.1-126 through 9.1-137 or 58 in the Sex Offender and Crimes Against Minors Registry maintained by the Department of State Police pursuant to Chapter 9 (§ 9.1-900 et seq.) of Title 9.1, except to the extent that information is required to be posted on the Internet pursuant to § 9.1-913; 59 60

61 4. Contained in the Virginia Juvenile Justice Information System as defined in §§ 16.1-222 through 62 16.1-225;

63 5. Maintained by agencies concerning persons required by law to be licensed in the Commonwealth to engage in the practice of any profession, in which case the names and addresses of persons applying 64 65 for or possessing the license may be disseminated upon written request to a person engaged in the 66 profession or business of offering professional educational materials or courses for the sole purpose of 67 providing the licensees or applicants for licenses with informational materials relating solely to available 68 professional educational materials or courses, provided the disseminating agency is reasonably assured 69 that the use of the information will be so limited;

6. Maintained by the Parole Board, the Crime Commission, the Judicial Inquiry and Review 70 71 Commission, the Virginia Racing Commission, and the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control;

72 7. Maintained by the Department of State Police; the police department of the Chesapeake Bay 73 Bridge and Tunnel Commission; police departments of cities, counties, and towns; and the campus 74 police departments of public institutions of higher education as established by Chapter 17 (§ 23-232 et 75 seq.) of Title 23, and that deal with investigations and intelligence gathering relating to criminal activity; 76 and maintained by local departments of social services regarding alleged cases of child abuse or neglect 77 while such cases are also subject to an ongoing criminal prosecution; 78

8. Maintained by the Virginia Port Authority as provided in § 62.1-132.4 or 62.1-134.1;

79 9. Maintained by the Virginia Tourism Authority in connection with or as a result of the promotion 80 of travel or tourism in the Commonwealth, in which case names and addresses of persons requesting information on those subjects may be disseminated upon written request to a person engaged in the 81 business of providing travel services or distributing travel information, provided the Virginia Tourism 82 83 Authority is reasonably assured that the use of the information will be so limited;

10. Maintained by the Division of Consolidated Laboratory Services of the Department of General 84 Services and the Department of Forensic Science, which deal with scientific investigations relating to 85 criminal activity or suspected criminal activity, except to the extent that § 9.1-1104 may apply; 86

11. Maintained by the Department of Corrections or the Office of the State Inspector General that 87 88 deal with investigations and intelligence gathering by persons acting under the provisions of Chapter 3.2 89 (§ 2.2-307 et seq.);

12. Maintained by (i) the Office of the State Inspector General or internal audit departments of state 90 91 agencies or institutions that deal with communications and investigations relating to the State Employee 92 Fraud, Waste, and Abuse Hotline or (ii) an auditor appointed by the local governing body of any 93 county, city, or town or a school board that deals with local investigations required by § 15.2-2511.2; 94 and

95 13. Maintained by the Department of Social Services or any local department of social services 96 relating to public assistance fraud investigations.
