12103130D **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 171** 1 Offered January 11, 2012 2 3 Establishing a joint subcommittee to study reducing Medicaid costs by using telemedicine. Report. 4 Patron—Marshall, R.G. 5 6 Referred to Committee on Rules 7 8 WHEREAS, Virginia spends \$2.3 billion each year on its Medicaid program; and 9 WHEREAS, this amount is only expected to increase with implementation of the federal health care 10 reform: and WHEREAS, in light of the current budget crisis, it is unclear how the Commonwealth will meet 11 12 these increased spending requirements; and WHEREAS, telemedicine may help the Commonwealth reduce costs associated with the Medicaid 13 14 program; now, therefore, be it 15 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That a joint subcommittee be 16 established to study reducing Medicaid costs by using telemedicine. The joint subcommittee shall have a total membership of 15 members that shall consist of 12 legislative members and three nonlegislative 17 citizen members. Members shall be appointed as follows: seven members of the House of Delegates to 18 be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional 19 20 representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates; five members of the Senate to be 21 appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; two nonlegislative citizen members, one of whom shall be 22 a private provider of Medicaid services and one of whom shall be a representative of the Department of Medical Assistance Services, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; and one 23 24 nonlegislative citizen member, who shall be a Medicaid consumer, to be appointed by the Senate 25 Committee on Rules. Nonlegislative citizen members of the joint subcommittee shall be citizens of the Commonwealth of Virginia. Unless otherwise approved in writing by the chairman of the joint 26 27 subcommittee and the respective Clerk, nonlegislative citizen members shall only be reimbursed for 28 travel originating and ending within the Commonwealth of Virginia for the purpose of attending 29 meetings. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both 30 Clerks shall be required. The joint subcommittee shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among 31 its membership, who shall be members of the General Assembly. 32 In conducting its study, the joint subcommittee shall (i) examine the current use of telemedicine in 33 the Commonwealth and in other states; (ii) research methods of reducing Medicaid costs using 34 telemedicine; and (iii) consider other new technological advances used in other states to reduce costs 35 within the Medicaid program. 36 Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the House of Delegates. 37 Legal, research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint subcommittee shall be provided by the Division of Legislative Services. Technical assistance shall be provided by the 38 39 Department of Medical Assistance Services. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance 40 to the joint subcommittee for this study, upon request. 41 The joint subcommittee shall be limited to four meetings for the 2012 interim and four meetings for the 2013 interim, and the direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$26,160 for each year without 42 approval as set out in this resolution. Approval for unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require 43 the written authorization of the chairman of the joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk. If a 44 45 companion joint resolution of the other chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall 46 be required. 47 No recommendation of the joint subcommittee shall be adopted if a majority of the House members or a majority of the Senate members appointed to the joint subcommittee (i) vote against the 48 49 recommendation and (ii) vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the 50 joint subcommittee. 51 The joint subcommittee shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2012, and for 52 the second year by November 30, 2013, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative 53 Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for each year. Each executive summary shall 54 55 state whether the joint subcommittee intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The 56 executive summaries and reports shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of 57 Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be 58

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posted on the General Assembly's website. 59

- Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or delay the period for the conduct of the study, or authorize additional meetings during the 2012 or 2013 60
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
