12104532D **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 295** 1 2 Offered February 1, 2012 3 Celebrating the life of William Mathias Jones. 4 Patrons-O'Bannon and Peace 5 6 WHEREAS, William Mathias Jones, a distinguished World War II veteran who played a pivotal role 7 in the design of miles of the Virginia interstate highway system, died on December 18, 2011; and WHEREAS, as a young man, William Jones demonstrated the extraordinary courage and resolve that 8 9 marked his generation as he joined the United States Army in support of the nation's efforts in World 10 War II: and WHEREAS, a member of the 2nd Armored Division as a ground and air forward observer and tank 11 commander, William Jones served in five European campaigns, including the Battle of the Bulge and 12 the Invasion of Normandy; and 13 14 WHEREAS, a recipient of the Silver Star for gallantry in action and the Bronze Star with oak leaf cluster for bravery, William Jones earned a Purple Heart for wounds received while directing artillery 15 16 fire at the Battle of the Bulge; and WHEREAS, after his meritorious military service, William Jones returned to civilian life, earning 17 bachelor's and master's degrees at Purdue University and embarking on a career in engineering that 18 19 eventually brought him to Richmond in 1955 as the managing partner for Blackburn, Brown and 20 Blauvelt, Inc.; and 21 WHEREAS, in 1962 William Jones founded American Engineers and oversaw its expansion to locations along the East Coast and its design of miles of the Virginia interstate highway system, the 22 23 Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority, and the Charlotte Outer Loop; and WHEREAS, a trusted professional, William Jones was appointed to the National Defense Executive 24 25 Reserve of the Federal Highway Administration as the traffic coordinator in the event of a national 26 emergency: and 27 WHEREAS, William Jones was honored for his remarkable accomplishments in his profession with 28 an Outstanding Civil Engineer Award from the Virginia section of the American Society of Civil 29 Engineers; and 30 WHEREAS, throughout his career, William Jones took an active role in community affairs, 31 supporting his fellow veterans as a member of American Legion Post 84 and serving as a charter member of the Bull and Bear Club and member of the West End Rotary Club, Navy League of 32 33 Richmond, and St. Stephen's Episcopal Church; and WHEREAS, a man of great integrity, William Jones leaves behind a sterling legacy of service to the 34 35 community, the Commonwealth, and the nation; and WHEREAS, a devoted family man, William Jones will be greatly missed by his wife, Shirley; sons, 36 37 Bruce and Barry, and their families; and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be 38 it 39 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring. That the General Assembly hereby 40 note with great sadness the loss of an admired citizen of the Commonwealth, William Mathias Jones; 41 and, be it RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution 42 for presentation to the family of William Mathias Jones as an expression of the General Assembly's 43 44 respect for his memory.
