5 WHEREAS, Boaz & Ruth, Inc., a nonprofit community revitalization and employment training 7 organization centered in Richmond's Highland Park, celebrates its 10th year of service in 2012; and

8 WHEREAS, with funding from religious and corporate organizations, Boaz & Ruth has restored
9 abandoned buildings and homes, created employment opportunities, and changed lives; before Boaz &
10 Ruth began its work in Highland Park, as many as 80 percent of the community's buildings were
11 boarded up or abandoned; and

WHEREAS, the Highland Park neighborhood has begun to re-emerge as a hub of small businessenterprise and neighborhood activity, in large part as a result of Boaz & Ruth's revitalization work; and

WHEREAS, Boaz & Ruth's successful vocational training efforts for criminal offenders have resulted in a recidivism rate of less than 12 percent among people who have completed the organization's job training and support programs; and

WHEREAS, the spirit of Boaz & Ruth is exemplified in the tireless work of its chief executive
officer, Martha Rollins, who has been part of an emerging business and community renaissance in the
