WHEREAS, in 1993 Jay Chen drew upon his journalism background to found a monthly publication, *Asian Fortune*, to meet the needs of the Pan-Asian community in the metropolitan Washington, D.C., area; and

WHEREAS, Jay Chen took great pride in uniting the Pan-Asian community through the sharing of news and local events in *Asian Fortune*, which reaches hundreds of thousands of readers; and

WHEREAS, an admired business and community leader, Jay Chen will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his loving family members and friends and numerous admirers throughout the metropolitan Washington, D.C., area; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Delegates hereby note with great sadness the loss of a dedicated community leader and outstanding Virginian, Jizeng Chen; and, be it
