11	1. That § 24.2-1004 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 24.2-1004. Illegal voting and registrations.
12 13 14 15	A. Any person who wrongfully deposits a ballot in the ballot container or casts a vote on any voting
14	equipment, is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
	B. Any person who intentionally (i) votes more than once in the same election, whether those votes
16 17	are cast in Virginia or in Virginia and any other state or territory of the United States, (ii) procures,
	assists, or induces another to vote more than once in the same election, whether those votes are cast in Virginia or in Virginia and any other state or territory of the United States (iii) votes knowing that he is
18 19	Virginia or in Virginia and any other state or territory of the United States, (iii) votes knowing that he is not qualified to vote where and when the vote is to be given, or (iv) procures, assists, or induces
20	another to vote knowing that such person is not qualified to vote where and when the vote is to be
21	given is guilty of a Class 6 felony.
22	C. Any person who intentionally (i) registers to vote at more than one residence address at the same
23	time, whether such registrations are in Virginia or in Virginia and any other state or territory of the
24	United States, or (ii) procures, assists, or induces another to register to vote at more than one address at
25	the same time, whether such registrations are in Virginia or in Virginia and any other state or territory
26	of the United States, is guilty of a Class 6 felony. This subsection shall not apply to any person who,

	when registering to vote, changing the address at which he is registered, transferring his registration, or
